Mater Christi is a vibrant triple stream primary school catering for approximately 710 students from 3 year old Kindy to Year Six. Our modern, well-resourced school is found at the end of a cul-de-sac overlooking Yangebup Lake. We offer an excellent education, provided by capable, caring and committed staff, all of whom work together with the strong support of our parents in the best interests of the children in our care. Strong parent-teacher partnerships are valued and we support the important role that parents have to play in developing their child's potential for learning. Families are welcomed into our school at all times and their contribution to the life of the school is valued highly. We offer a number of specialist programs including Drama, Music, Instrumental Music, Italian, Physical Education, Science, Reading Recovery and Enrichment. A comprehensive Learning Support program is effective across all classes. An active extra-curricular activities program is in place across performing arts, christian service, music, sustainability and sports.

As an educational community, we nurture in every student a belief in their individual potential and commit ourselves to helping them achieve this while respecting and protecting the rights of each other. Students are at the centre of all our educational endeavours and are encouraged to be open to new learning experiences.

As a faith community, we seek at all times to make Jesus real in the lives of our students, our families and our staff. We do this by modelling gospel values in our daily work. In particular, we strive always to demonstrate deep respect for the people we encounter. We have a close and supportive connection with our Parish and our liturgies are dynamic and sacred opportunities to further strengthen each person's relationship with Christ.

Facilities include playgrounds, oval, courts, a well-resourced library, Learning Hub (technology-rich learning area), a dedicated science room and well-equipped, fully airconditioned classrooms that are brought to life through the work of the children and by utilising the latest Apple technology to help facilitate effective learning.

Our Parents and Friends Association (P&F) is a dynamic element in our school culture. The focus of the P&F is three-fold – supporting the school in its endeavours by funding resources, building community among its members and empowering parents.

Professional Learning

The ongoing professional development of each staff member is highly valued. Professional learning can take many forms including whole school staff days, subject specific in-services, conferences, meetings, and a range of Professional Learning Community (PLC) meetings focussed on Literacy and Numeracy.

The School takes responsibility for planning, implementing, evaluating and recording staff professional development. All teachers have been involved in professional development opportunities during the year related to improving student outcomes. In 2017 our teaching staff were involved in at least four days each of formal, whole school Professional Development. These specific days included an attendance at the Notre Dame Education Conference, including a keynote presentation by Andrew Fuller on Neuroscience and Education. The school's link to Notre Dame University was continued with a focus on Staff Appraisal and Feedback by the Dean of Education, Associate Professor Michael O'Neil.

Later in the year the staff participated in a Professional Development day hosted by Dr Jan Grajczonek which looked into our ability to "Unpack the Gospels". This day enabled staff to attain 6 hours towards the knowledge component of their Accreditation to Teach Religious Education. Finally, all staff were involved in a day of whole school data analysis (using recent NAPLAN and PAT data), and an examination of three Quality Catholic Schooling components. These components included: Effective Pedagogical Practices, Engagement with the School Community, and Targeted Use of School Resources. In addition to this, Key Teachers attended additional training in the areas of VCOP, Problem Solving and Digital Technologies.

Student Profile

Mater Christi Catholic Primary School caters for students from 3 year old to Year 6. The average student attendance for students from Pre Primary to Year Six in 2017 was 92.46%.

Managing Student Non-Attendance

Regular attendance at school is essential if students are to maximise their potential. While it is the parents' legal responsibility to ensure that their children attend school regularly, our staff as part of their duty of care, monitor all absences and work in partnership with parents to support and promote the regular attendance of students. In doing so, Mater Christi, under the leadership of the Principal:

- Provides a caring environment which fosters in students, a sense of well-being and belonging to the school community.
- Maintains accurate records of student attendance
- Implements procedures to monitor student attendance and address nonattendance issues as and when they arise
- Communicates to parents and students, attendance requirements and the consequences of unsatisfactory attendance

School attendance records also contain information regarding student absences including reasons for absence and documentation to substantiate reasons for absences. Staff monitor non-attendance diligently and bring to the attention of the Assistant Principals and Principals any unexplained absences, non-attendance of a serious nature, or reasons for non-attendance that cause concern. The Principal may refer matters of concern to Catholic Education WA and relevant Government Authorities where appropriate.

<u>NAPLAN</u>

The National Assessment program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN), is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. NAPLAN assessment results provide valuable information about student achievements in Literacy and Numeracy. An analysis of these results assists Mater Christi's planning and is used to support teaching and learning programs.

The table below shows the percentages of students who achieved at or above the minimum national standard in each assessment. Literacy is reported in four content strands: Reading, Writing, Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation. Numeracy is reported as a single content strand.

Report on progress towards the Goals of our 2017 School Improvement Plan

Learning

• Throughout 2017 there was visible evidence that all staff members at the School collaborated to ensure we used a shared approach to our teaching and learning program (Pedagogy and Philosophy) with shared beliefs and understandings.

• By the end of 2017, the PLD Spelling Program in Years K-3 was embedded and Years 1-6 tracked the student results in the South Australian Spelling Test.

• A comprehensive number of Guided Reading resources for Yrs 1-6 and home readers across the whole school was purchased and a Reading Book Inventory was set up.

• The implementation of VCOP across the whole school continued with a particular focus on Oral Language.

Learning (continued)

• We consolidated the literacy of numeracy to ensure a common language across the school throughout 2017.

• At the beginning of 2017 an IT Key Teacher Team was formed to explore the integration of Digital Technologies across the curriculum and worked in upskilling and supporting staff in the integration of IT.

• This year we reviewed and updated the Kindy Semester One and Two reports as well as the Enrichment Report for Years 4-6 students.

Engagement

• Throughout 2017 more opportunities were provided to build on 21st Century Learning approaches in all classrooms.

•The modernising of the School Website and the updating of all the website documents was a focus throughout 2017 with input from parents, staff and specialist teachers.

•This year we successfully introduced the Seesaw App as a blogging site for K-Year 2 teachers and parents and the Yrs 3-6 teachers, specialists continued to use and develop their blogs using Blogger.

•All the above goals were greatly appreciated by the parents and enhanced the connection between the parents and the school.

Accountability

• Throughout 2017 the Asset Register was successfully set up, added to and ready for future input of data.

• Throughout 2017 staff reviewed the PP – Year 6 reports and consolidated their knowledge and use of SEQTA with a particular focus on pastoral care.

• The Early Childhood Team, Curriculum Leader and Principal reviewed the QIP and made suitable adjustments for 2017/2018.

Discipleship

• By the end of 2017 a Scope and Sequence of Formal Prayers taught across the Year Levels in their RE Units of Work was developed.

• Staff were led during a PD Day to recognise key gospels used throughout the RE Units of Work from PP – Year 6. Dr Jan Grajczonek helped us to unpack our understanding of them in the context of Jesus' time and understanding them in the context of our time.

• Throughout 2017 a focus on understanding the Liturgical Seasons of the Church's Year and Sacramental Life
