Ash Wednesday's Gospel Matthew 6: 1 – 6, 16 – 18

"When you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, who love to stand and pray in the synagogues and on street corners so that others may see them. "When you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites. Your child's teacher

Sometimes your child's teacher may be away. As with most professions, teachers need to continually update their knowledge, and courses are sometimes run on school days. Teachers also participate in professional learning after school, on weekends and during school holidays. Currently, many junior teachers are having one to one time with their children as they carry out the beginning of year assessments. Similarly, your child's teacher may be sick themselves, or need to care for a family member who may be unwell. The relief or casual teacher, will follow the usual teaching program for the day. If your child's teacher is away for a number of days, then we try to have the same casual teacher for the whole time.

Mater Christi's Car Park/Drive Thru Guidelines

Please ensure that you share these with any friends/family that may drop off or pick up your children.

C – Can you please ensure that you continue to drive all the way to the fire hydrant when you drop off/pick up the children? Even if there is no one behind you, please go to the very end to ensure that we maximize this space.

A - Accept that we reverse park at all times for the safety of our children and adults in the carpark.

R - Raise your family name signs so that the teachers can see your name clearly. This then enables them to call the children to the pick-up line quicker. Teachers cannot always identify parents through tinted windscreens. The office will organise a new sign if required.

P- Please always stay in your car during drop off and pick up times and never overtake another car.

A – Avoid the rush! Remember that you can pick up your children up to 3.30pm. Take some extra time and you'll have a smoother pick up. Are you driving all the way to the fire hydrant?

R- Respect all other drivers at all times and make sure that we aren't parking over our neighbour's driveways, on footpaths or on paved areas within the school.

K – Know that doing these very simple steps will help make it work more efficiently.


HOW WAS YOUR DAY?

- What is something you saw that made you think?
- Who did you play with today?
- What is something that challenged you?
- Did you like your lunch?
- Tell us your top two things from the day (before you can be excused from the dinner table!).
- What are you reading?
- If you could change one thing about your day, what would it be?
- What made you feel happy?
- What made you feel proud?
- What made you feel loved?
- Did you learn any new words today?
- If you could switch seats with anyone in class, who would it be? And why?
- If you switched places with your teacher tomorrow, what would you teach the class?

Rainbows

When something significant happens in the family, the whole family is affected. Even though death and divorce appears to be a grown-up problem, it does have a profound effect on the children it touches. Rainbows is a program designed especially for children who are living in single parent families, or families going through significant transitions.

Rainbows fosters emotional healing among children grieving a loss from a life-altering crisis or other significant changes in their life. Rainbows provides a safe, confidential and caring environment for young people to sort through their pain and confusion, build self-esteem and learn coping tools to deal with their change, loss and grief. The goal is to assist participants in expressing feelings, understand and talk about these feelings and to learn to let go of them and get on with living. The facilitator assists the participants in expressing feelings.

The program consists of twelve weekly sessions conducted during school hours. This year the staff member trained to facilitate the Rainbows Program is Mrs Michelle Romano. 




