Dear Parents and Caregivers

Sunday's Gospel *Mark 6:30-34*

In the Gospel, we hear the Twelve referred to as "apostles." The word *apostle* is a Greek word meaning "one who is sent." Jesus chose twelve men from among his disciples whom he sent to share in his ministry of preaching and healing.

We who are Jesus' disciples today have also been sent to share the Gospel with others. Perhaps our commitment to following Jesus as his disciple leaves us feeling tired and overwhelmed. In Sunday's Gospel, we hear Jesus affirm the importance of times of rest and renewal. Jesus wanted his disciples to come away and spend time alone with him. This is what we seek and find in our life of prayer and in our celebration of the Eucharist.

Welcome back to school for Term Three. Getting back into routine can be a bit of a shock to the system after being away from the bells and timetables of school life. Nevertheless, when children are supported in setting up and sticking to a consistent home routine involving bed times, home learning time, morning routines and fun times, many barriers to learning are removed. Establishing that routine can be one of the challenges of parenting but persistence pays off, so hang in there!


P&F Meeting

Sacrament of the Eucharist


