#### Your child's teacher

#### Evacuation

Yesterday morning around 8.30am work was being carried out in the school that set off the smoke detector and the evacuation alarm sounded. Staff and students are very aware of the process and followed procedures by evacuating their areas and moved to the oval promptly. As parents and visitors we may not be fully aware of the procedures and that we must comply when instructed by the Evacuation Warden. If an evacuation occurs before school or towards the end of the school day please adhere to the following:



- If you are attempting to drive into the school grounds, a Warden may instruct you not to enter the school and park your car on the grass verge waiting in your car with your children. DO NOT GET OUT OF THE CAR AND WALK YOUR CHILDREN IN OR SEND THEM TO THE CLASSROOM.
- If you are parked within the school grounds and you are walking your child to class and the evacuation siren goes, GO STRAIGHT TO THE OVAL WITH YOUR CHILD AND FIND YOUR CHILD'S TEACHER.
- If you are gathered with some parents outside the classrooms and the children are in class and the siren goes, GO STRAIGHT TO THE OVAL.

Following an evacuation or a drill we always debrief so that any corrections and improvements can be made. Thank you for assisting us with this and ensuring that in a likelihood of an evacuation we can confidently go about our duty in ensuring the safety of everyone within our School and Parish grounds.

#### **Class News**

#### Kindergarten

Wow Term 3 already! Welcome back to a fun and exciting term ahead. We will be encouraging the children to develop and explore their imaginations with our different themed home corners. We are continuing to focus on a story each week and will be making lots of wonderful creations in Kindy.

The main focuses are:

- Speaking in short sentences and narrative retell skills
- Learning the sound of the letters S,A,T,P,I,N,M,R,C,H,E,D
- Exploring rhyming words
- Developing our news telling skills
- Subitising with objects
- Cardinality –the last number represents the whole collection
- Numeral recognition
- Learning about our different emotions and feelings
- Wondering about the water, the rain cycle and our growing and changing feelings and how they relate to God
- Developing our pencil grip, cutting and colouring-in skills

Please remember to bring in your child's news item each week. Thank you for all support and we can't wait for more fun in Kindy.

#### **Pre-Primary**

In Pre-Primary this term the children will once again be exposed to many activities where they will be encouraged to learn through hands on experiences. Our theme for Term Three will be minibeasts. Together we will discover and investigate a variety of mini-beasts and create our own model of an insect out of salt dough. In addition to learning about mini-beasts our focus will be on one of our favourite children's authors, Eric Carle! The children will explore storybooks written and illustrated by Eric Carle and they will 'have a go' at being an author as well!

In Religious Education the children will be immersed in the many ways we can talk to God. They will write their own thankyou prayers and also come to realise that we can talk to God anywhere and anytime. They will learn to recognise the different feelings we have been given and that God wants us to express our feelings in loving ways.

In Literacy the children will be working towards becoming independent writers by listening for the sounds in words and using their letter sound knowledge to write words and sentences. They will continue to have a strong focus on reading as they learn to read decodable texts and early sight words.



In Numeracy the children will be working on their recognition and ordering of numbers beyond 20. They will also be exposed to the language used in addition and simple addition stories. Concrete objects and hands on activities will be used to identify and explore 3D shapes.

Don't forget there will also be a special time for our Dads to join us for a Father's day morning at Pre-Primary.

On Friday 1st September we will be having our Father's Day 'Mini-Olympics.' Please save the date as it is a very special time in the Pre-Primary calendar. It is anticipated we will commence the fun at 9.00 a.m. and conclude at approximately 11.00 a.m.

#### Year 1

Welcome to Term Three! Our first significant event this term is our 100<sup>th</sup> day of school, which we will celebrated today. This term we also have our class assembly, which we are beginning to practice and getting very excited about! Following this we have book week, an excursion, our Learning Journey and an incursion.



In Religion, we will be focusing on how we belong to a family, school, parish and community and how we can use our learning gifts to help others, as Jesus did.



In English, we are exploring narratives and Dreamtime stories. To enhance this experience, we will be visiting Herdsman Lake Wildlife Centre. In addition to this, we will look at Australia and Australian animals. We will learn how to write information reports, narratives and further develop our descriptive writing abilities.

During Numeracy, we are learning about different shapes and will explore location and fractions. We will continue to build on the number of mental strategies we can use to solve equations and revise time and money.

We are looking forward to the busy term ahead!

#### Year 2

Welcome back to Term 3! We have another exciting term planned. We will be learning about the amazing mini beasts in our environment. The Year Two's will also keep busy looking after our wormeries in the school garden. We will be discussing the olden days in History where the children will have fun comparing life today to that of the past.



In English, we will be focusing on report writing and poetry. We will continue to build confidence in using the comprehension strategies. Oral language skills will be further developed through our news program. During Math's lessons, we will be learning about money, fractions and time.



The two topics for Religion this term are 'Jesus Forgives' and 'Joining in the Lord's Meal'. Don't forget to check Seesaw for updates and information on the exciting things happening this term.

All classes are participating in 'choral speech' for the Performing Arts Festival and it's our turn for an assembly item. Stay tuned for more on these two events not to be missed!

The Year Two Team

#### Year 3



Bonjour! Ciao! Guten Tag! G'Day! Dia Dhuit! This term in Year 3 we travel to and explore the different cultural celebrations around the world. We take a trip to the Perth Zoo and have the opportunity to research a variety of animal species. This will culminate in each student writing an information report on an animal of their choice throughout our Literacy program. In Religious Education we cover the units 'Water of Life' (Baptism) and begin our

preparations for the Sacrament of Reconciliation with the unit Christian Conscience (Penance). In Numeracy the students will learn more about multiplication and division, fractions, symmetry and data. In Health we move our way through the body systems to find out how to maintain a healthy, balanced lifestyle. Integrated with our Literacy and SOSE program is Visual Art. Fasten your seatbelts, place your seats in the upright position and enjoy the journey!



#### Year 4

Term Three is a very special time for our Year Four students who are preparing to receive the sacrament of Communion for the first time in August. In Religion, they are learning about how the Eucharist is an invitation to a celebration, in which

a meal is shared, much like Jesus shared with his disciples at The Last Supper. The students will unpack the book of Exodus, making links between The Last Supper and the celebration of Passover. The students will also learn about the four parts of a Mass including the: Introductory Rite, Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of the Eucharist and the Concluding Rite. In Reading, the focus



Chickens will be taking up residence in Year Four this term and will provide the stimulus for our writing. The students will learn to use their senses to describe the chickens developmental journey and experiment with literary devices including figurative language, similes, metaphors, personifications and allegories. They will also explore the structure and formal language used in the information report writing genre. In Mathematics, the main Number focus this term will be fractions. This will include representing parts of a whole as a fraction,

recognising equivalent fractions, ordering and adding fractions and converting fractions from improper to a mixed number. In Measurement, the focus will be on telling the time to the minute and calculating elapsed time. In Statistics and Probability, the students will explore the likelihood of both independent and dependent events. In HASS, students research famous ancient explorers and retrace their voyages that changed the world. They also learn about convicts and their importance in the days of European settlement, culminating in an excursion to the famous Fremantle Prison.

#### Year 5

Welcome back to Term Three! With two weeks already down, this term is going to fly by. We give a big welcome to Ms. Rachael Sita who is the new teacher in 5C. In Mathematics, we are focusing on fractions, decimals and percentages as well as looking at Statistics and Probability. In English, our text type is Information Reports and in Reading we will be looking at improving our oral language and comprehension skills. In H.A.S.S we are exploring the government and what it means to be a democracy. In following up with the Health programs run by our School Counsellor, Rebecca Rowland in Semester One, we are focusing



our attention to student wellbeing. We will be developing our coding skills in Digital Technology by learning how to program Sphero Robots through our very own mazes. In Religious Education, students will revise for the Bishops Literacy Assessment to be held in Week Four and will then complete the units of study, 'We Are Called' and 'Nourishing Our Goodness.' It is going to be a very exciting term and we look forward to displaying our work at the Learning Journey in Week Eight.

#### Year 6



This term is action packed with events! We have our Year 6 Debate Night, Learning Journey, Family Life Presentations, Life Skills for Life Incursion, Interschool Carnivals and the Preforming Arts Festival. In Religious Education we will be studying the Sacrament of Baptism and brushing up on our Bible skills. During English we will examine persuasive devices and

strategies, which will then lead us into debating. This will culminate in a Debate Night which will be held in Week 7.

We would love to see you all there to make this night as memorable as it promises to be. In Mathematics this term, we focus on fractions, decimals and percentages, and HASS gives us an opportunity to extend upon our knowledge of Economics and Business in inquiry-based tasks. The Year Six students will be training hard to reach their goals in the classroom and on the field for Health Education. Semester Two promises to be the best yet and we look forward to some great adventures together.







#### Music

Welcome back to another exciting term of Music!

This term, the Pre-Primary and Year 1 students will be concentrating on, beat and creating their own rhythm patterns. Years 2 and 3 will be exploring music notation and playing simple songs on the glockenspiel. Years 4, 5 and 6 will be exploring how to use Timbre to enhance their performances. PP-6 will also continue learning about music technologies specifically Garage Band using the iPads.



The 2017 Catholic Performing Arts Festival has begun and we are off to a great start! Last week, 5C performed in the Christian Drama section while Tayla Rijavec and Kashvi Patel performed in the Bible Reading. On Friday, Zac Zammit, our Arts Captains and Miss Kalat represented the school at the opening mass for the festival. In week 2, we had our Guitar Ensemble and Alicia Savy take part in the Instrumental Ensemble and Instrumental solo sections. Congratulations to all these students.

Thank you to our Drama and Guitar Teacher Mrs Pottier & Mr Yusof for preparing these students for their performances.

Many of our students will be involved in various sections of the festival this year including Primary Choral Singing, Instrumental Ensembles, Dance, Drama, Choral Speech, Bible Reading and Instrumental solos. This year we have over 300 students involved in the festival. We wish everyone involved all the very best!

Last term, we said farewell to Mr Richard Price our Violin Teacher. We would like to thank him for his contribution to the Instrumental Program over the years and wish him all the very best in the future.

#### **Pre-Primary**

Explore: PUSH/PULL

- push and pull forces
- move objects in ways such as sliding, bouncing and spinning

#### Year 1

Investigate: LIGHT AND SOUND

- sources of light and sound
- how they are produced
- how light and sound travel
- The role of light and sound in our lives and our community



#### Year 2

Explore pushes and pulls: PUSH/PULL and GRAVITY

- how these forces act in air, water, and on the ground
- Identify the effect of the pull of gravity
- learn that both air and water can 'push'

#### Year 3

Investigate different heat sources: CONDUCTIVITY

- how heat moves from one object to another
- investigate the differences in conductivity of materials

#### Year 4

Explore: MAGNETS

- how magnets exert a force on certain objects
- how that force affects the objects
- Gain an understanding of gravity, friction and magnetic forces at work in their everyday lives

#### Year 5

#### Explore: LIGHT – REFLECT/ABSORB/REFRACT

- the properties of light and how it enables us to see
- light and its role in our lives and our community
- explain how objects reflect, absorb and refract light
- how we can use light to meet our needs

#### Year 6

#### Explore: CIRCUITS and SWITCHES

- the role of electrons in transferring energy in electric circuits
- investigate batteries, light bulbs, switches, conductors and insulators
- explain how battery-operated devices, for example, a torch, work





#### **Physical Education**

Term 3 is all about Athletics. The whole school will be taken through its paces in a wide range of athletic endeavours.
