Some of the current topics covered are: Coding, Robotics, STEM Challenges, Forensic Science, Critical Thinking Challenges, Short Films and Choose your Own Adventure Stories. Students who have been successfully chosen for the Enrichment program will be notified by the end of Term Four in preparation for classes to begin in Term One 2020.




Welcome


The schedule for the event is as follows:



CONTINUED CHANGES TO THE PROCESS!


In 2020, bulk stationery orders in Kindy - Year 1 will extend into Year 2.
