The second day of the Interschool Athletics Carnival was held the following day. The day commenced with the 200m sprints. Mater Christi had some fantastic results with all our runners giving everything. Next on the programme were the 80m and 100m events. Again, the athletes from Mater Christi excelled and gave the other schools a real run for their money.

The day was rounded off by the team events in Multi-Age Relay, Leaderball and the Circular Relay.

The Mixed Leaderball and both types of relay events are difficult events because any small mistakes are punished. Another harsh reality is that there are only four place getters and with nine schools competing, it is a real battle to score points. Each Year group pushed themselves to get the most out of their bodies. There was some drama with a few batons getting dropped and a few catches



being spilled but this is all part of life. Mistakes will be made but we learnt quickly. We had some superb results. At the end of two days of intense competition the Mater Christi crew had done themselves proud. With nine schools competing it was going to be close. After a tough two days, we were hoping to go back to back and win the title. Going into the relays and leaderball we were in the lead but we had to hold our nerve. With some outstanding running and leaderball skills the Mater Christi athletes came home strong and blitzed the opposition. The Mighty Mater Christi Mongooses retained the title as the best athletes in town. The whole team should be proud of the way they competed fiercely and in the right spirit.
