Dear Parents and Caregivers

### **Sunday's Gospel Account**

"Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." Matthew 22: 15 — 21.

We do it, we might not like it, but we do it. We pay taxes. In Israel in Jesus' day, paying taxes to Rome was not popular and the annual 'census tax' could only be paid using a Roman denarius coin, which had the head of the Emperor on it. This meant that both the act of paying the tax and the image on the coin were offensive to the Jewish people. Some were concerned that by using the denarius they would offend God as they would be paying allegiance to Caesar. Yet in the final line of this Gospel story, Jesus assures them by saying..., "So give back to Caesar what is Caesar's, and to God what is God's." Jesus isn't concerned about whose head is on the coin, or who is receiving the coin. His concern is about the intention in which one gives. In reading and reflecting on this text, one might wonder, "How do I thank God for the example of faith in the lives around me? How can I more fully give to God?"

Jesus was saying that the rules of the land need to be followed but don't make materialism and commercialism become all that we follow. God must play a significant part in our lives.

Mrs Russell 2A, will be expecting her first baby in March of next year. She will finish her time with us at the end of this year.



## School News


### Kindergarten



Term 4 is going to be filled with fun and excitement as we extend our skills that we have learnt throughout the year and become prepared for Pre-Primary! ### Pre-Primary

What a busy and exciting term we are going to have in Pre-Primary! Our theme for the first half of Term Four is 'Rumble in the Jungle'. Our activities will encompass all things Jungle! Welcome back to our fourth and final term together, we can't believe we are here already! This term promises to be an exciting one as the warm weather makes it all that much easier to get up in the morning.


This term we will be learning about:

## Year Three

The term ahead is definitely a busy one for the Year 3's. We begin the term with final preparations for the Sacrament of Reconciliation and then we move into our final units of work for the year, Gathered As One (Church) and Gifted By The Word (Advent/Lent). During Literacy, we will tackle both Poetry and Myth and Legends and Fables with the students. Our Numeracy program sees us continue to focus on number & place value, with students revising and consolidating concepts such as addition, time, subtraction, multiplication & division. Our HASS program focuses on Communities. In Health we will be focusing Protective Behaviours. We are looking forward to a fantastic term in Year 3.





## Year Six



Year Six Term Four is off to a flying start. There is a lot going on and there isn't much time to take it easy. We have already begun preparing for our graduation with weekly dance lessons, these will be a big hit come graduation day.

We are enjoying participating in Parish Masses, as we deepen our understanding of prayer during Religious Education. We are also looking forward to the season of Advent which is rapidly approaching.

In our Numeracy Dedicated Time, we are rolling the dice, taking a chance and recording the data as we delve in the Statistics and Probability strand. This term also sees us use our knowledge from Term 3 to convert a variety of metric units of measurement.

We are exploring the novel 'Wonder' by Raquel J. Palacio during Literacy Dedicated Time as we broaden our understanding of comprehension strategies. In writing our focus is reports where we are compiling a variety of newspaper articles.

The Year Sixes are ecstatic about their final term in primary school and before they know it they will be heading into high school.

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## Drama

This Term in Drama the students will prepare for the end of year concert. Each year level will go through the process of a rehearsal schedule. Learning choreography, practising, collaborating as a group and putting the song and dance routine together for a performance as a whole school.



Both Junior and Senior students will also be given the opportunity to further develop their Creativity with the focus on Process Drama. Where groups of students collaborate within role-play situations to explore and express ideas with the use of props and materials.

### *Making Jesus Real*

With the beginning of this last term for 2017, the importance of reflection is encouraged as we keep our focus on the important question - Where was Jesus in my Life today?

The students are taught about the importance of including people, about body language, eye contact and the importance of forgiveness and gratitude. With a welcoming attitude and the willingness to say sorry and thank you our students and teachers Make Jesus Real at Mater Christi.

### *Our Focus - Social Decision Making*


Developing social decision-making skills helps us to consider the consequences of our actions for ourselves and others and helps us to make thoughtful, effective decisions. This involves:

- Understanding how a social situation makes us feel
- Considering the different choices, along with the positive and negative consequences of these actions, when making a decision
- Making positive choices, while considering how these choices may affect ourselves and others

Through explicit teaching and role play the children will be learning how to respond safely as a bystander in a bullying situation.

The students are learning that to support someone when you see bullying happening has two benefits;

1. It helps the person being bullied
2. It sends a clear message to the person engaging in bullying behaviour that this behaviour is not tolerated in our school.



## Music

Welcome back to the best term of the year...TERM 4!

Term 4 is one of our busiest and most exciting times in the school calendar, especially in Music.

During music lessons our junior students will focus on the following musical elements: beat, rhythm, dynamics and tempo. Our senior students will be comparing music from around the world and creating and performing their compositions in small groups.

Preparations are underway for the 2017 Mater Christi End of Year Concert. Students from Pre-Primary to Year 6 will be preparing for our annual concert during Music and Drama lessons. More information regarding times and costumes will be placed in the newsletter later in the term.

Our Instrumental Program is up and running. Forms to learn an instrument in 2018 will go out soon, so please keep an eye out.

\*Please note that students do not automatically stay in the Instrumental Program. You must re-enroll your child if they wish to continue in 2018. Please feel free to come and see me in the Music Room if you have any further questions.

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## Science

The Science classroom is abuzz with new topics this term, as we start our study of Earth and Space Science. Pre-primary are becoming weather reporters to learn about the features of weather. They will be investigating how the weather affects us in our daily lives.

The Year 1 classes are learning about how natural and man-made features undergo changes over different time scales. They are even growing their own plants and making predictions about how these garden beds will change over time!

The Year 2 classes are beginning to explore the water cycle and how we can use our natural resources responsibly. They have been spending lots of time outside investigating evaporation and run off.




The Year 3 classes are tracing Copernicus' footsteps to learn about our Earth, Sun and Moon and how these objects move by rotating and orbiting. They will be investigating how shadows are formed and how they move throughout the day.

The Year 4 classes are dusting off their magnifying glasses to explore rocks, soils and landscapes and are investigating how these can be affected by human and natural processes.

The Year 5 classes are jumping into virtual spaceships to explore the solar system, our sun and different constellations.

The Year 6 classes are wearing their protective suits and exploring natural disasters, particularly volcanoes and earthquakes and how these change the Earth's surface. They will be investigating the viscosity of different lava flows and analysing seismic data.
