2nd Week of Lent – Project Compassion – brings you Martina's story

For Martina, an East Timorese mother of eight, escaping domestic violence was the first step in her journey to a new life. But at first, her future seemed very uncertain. Timor-Leste is one of the least developed countries in the world, with extremely low levels of basic health, literacy and income. Most East Timorese live in rural areas, with very limited access to basic services or livelihood training, and many households don't have enough food year round.

The shelter where Martina sought refuge, Uma PAS, offered her many ways to transcend these challenges. Uma PAS is a partner in Caritas Australia's Protection Program, a holistic community-wide program in Timor-Leste that offers women like Martina economic empowerment and a life of safety in a supportive community.

Through the program, she was linked with a network of support services, and this enabled her to undertake livelihood training and start a small business to support her children. The program also linked her with a supportive community.


"Martina is a person who did not want to give up, but wanted to be able to support her family," her counsellor at the shelter says. Through the Protection Program, Martina says, "I have learnt how to change my life to support myself, and my children."

Uniform Shop News

Attention all year one students (especially girls) and all NEW students in the school.

In term two and three our school students are required to wear Winter Uniform.

For the boys this will mean you will require a school Jumper and Trousers (not compulsory).

For the girls it will mean you will need a Yellow Shirt, Winter Skirt and Jumper with either navy stockings or the school navy socks. If your child is a senior (year four - six) they will be required to wear a tie too.

On **Thursday March 23rd** I will schedule appointments for your convenience to try on uniforms.

A timetable is currently displayed on the Uniform Shop window for you to write your child's name alongside your preferred time to attend. As is stated on the timetable, due to tight scheduling, you must have collected your child from his/her class PRIOR to your allocated time and BE AT THE UNIFORM SHOP for your appointment time, otherwise the system will not work efficiently.

Please be aware that the appointments are only 15 minutes, so please come ready to QUICKLY try-on the uniform.

As a courtesy to other parents, I ask that you please **do not bring your child into the uniform shop for fittings during peak times**, which are between 8:15 - 8:40am and 2:50 - 3:20pm as this does take time and delays other customers.

If you wish to purchase without fitting, please use the online Uniform Ordering system that you can find on the Mater Christi web site. Alternatively, you may wish to complete an order form available from the office, and send it to school with cash in an envelope marked "Uniform Shop" or fill in your credit card details and leave at the office for myself to collect. Your order will then be processed and sent to your child's class room for them to take home.

Thank you for your co-operation and I look forward to seeing many of you in the Uniform Shop over the coming weeks.

Friendly schools Plus - Resilience

Our school is continuing to create a friendly and supportive culture. The resources we are using are based on evidence from 12 years of empirical research from the Child Health Promotion Research Centre. The resource materials aim to help schools to encourage positive social behaviour and reduce bullying behaviour.

Our goals for a supportive school culture:

- To continue to provide all students with opportunities to develop and practise getting along with other children through classroom learning activities.
- Create a positive social environment within our school which actively discourages bullying.
- Continue to encourage staff, students and parents to treat all school community members with respect, care and compassion.

Families' role in creating a supportive school culture.

Research demonstrates that efforts to change the attitudes and behaviour of students are more likely to be successful if families are actively involved and share a sense of ownership over the process.

- Talk regularly with your children about what might be happening at school.
- Encourage your children to 'ask for help' if they are being bullied at school or someone is being unkind.
- If your children are fighting at home, help them discuss their problem and come to a mutual solution.
- Encourage your children to be assertive by helping them to practise speaking in a firm but friendly way, making eye contact, looking calm and smiling and feeling good about themselves.

Our Resiliency programme is a priority and we will continue to help students develop strategies to prevent bullying as well as developing social skills and resiliency factors.

As a community, it is important that all teachers, parents and children are all on the same page when discussing Bullying. With this in mind, we are providing you with a definition of Bullying, taken from the resource,

'Friendly Schools Plus'.

What is bullying?

Bullying is a repeated behaviour that may be physical, verbal, and /or psychological and where there is intent to cause fear, distress, or harm to another: that is conducted by a more powerful individual or group, against a less powerful individual or group who is or are unable to stop this from happening. Bullying is when a person or a group of people offline or online (mobile phone or Internet):

- Make fun of / tease someone in a mean and hurtful way.
- Tell lies or spread nasty rumours about someone to try to make others not like him/her.
- Leave someone out on purpose or not allow him/her to join in.
- Hit, kick or push someone around.
- Deliberately damage, destroy or steal someone's things.
- Threaten or make someone feel afraid of getting hurt.



It is NOT bullying when:

- Teasing is done in a friendly, playful way.
- Two people who are as strong as each other argue or fight.



Cyberbullying – using a mobile phone or computer to:

- Send nasty messages or threatening emails.
- Send mean or nasty comments or pictures about others to websites e.g. *MYSpace*, *Facebook*, *MSN* or other students phones.
- Deliberately leaves others out over the internet.
- Pretends to be someone else online to hurt them or make them look foolish.

NetSetGO Netball 2017 at MCCPS

The NetSetGO skills-based netball program will be running at Mater Christi again in Terms Two and Three. This national program incorporates skills, learning activity and introductory game play. Further information can be found at <http://netsetgo.asn.au/parents/faq/>.

We can currently provide this program for year two and three (numbers capped at 10 participants per coach). We'd like to also offer the NetSetGo program to year one, however we do not have a year one coach at present.

As our year one program (numbers capped at eight participants per coach plus assistant) is dependent upon a suitable coach being willing to volunteer their time, we are keen to hear from anyone interested. Coaches will have all session planning done for them, but must be able to commit their time each week for the duration of the program.

We're also keen to hear from anyone willing to assist with coaching the year two or three, as this would enable more children to participate. Please contact me if you are willing and able to join us or if you'd like more information.

Term Two NetSetGo will run from 1 May to 19 June, 3:15 - 4:00 pm on Mondays (8 sessions). The cost is \$70. Netball Australia will send all participants a pack which will include a size 4 netball and a NetSetGo T-shirt. For those who have participated in Term Two, the Term Three cost drops to \$40.

How To Install Skoolbag On Your Smartphone

For iPhone and iPad users:

1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
3. You will see your school appear, click "Get" then "install".
4. The app is FREE to download.
5. When installed click "Open"
6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.



For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
4. Click the "Install" button.
5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
6. Click "Open" when installed.
7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.



Please Note: Some brands of Android phones need the setting in "Notification Manager" changed to "Allow" instead of "Notify" in order for the push notifications to work. The phone must also be running at least version 4 system software to run the app.

For Windows 81 Phone and Windows 81 or 10 device users:

1. Go to the Windows Store on your 81 Windows Phone or Windows 81/10 Device
2. Search for "Skoolbag" in the keyword app search
3. Install the Skoolbag app
4. Find your school either by using the keyword search or location service.
5. Click the "Pin" icon to pin the school tile to your Windows Phone home screen.
6. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup"
7. Toggle the Push Categories that are applicable to you by tapping the on/off switch.

Please Note: The Skoolbag Windows App is for 81 version Windows Phones, or Windows 81 and 10 devices.
