Dear Parents



This Sunday we celebrate a special feast of Jesus, the Feast of Christ the King. Jesus was a different kind of king.

He was born in a little village, the child of a peasant woman.

He learned to be a carpenter, and worked in his father's carpentry business until he was thirty years old. Then he spent three years as an itinerant preacher, telling people about God and God's love.

He never wrote any book. He never held any office. He never went to a university.

He never had a family or a house of his own. He never travelled more than 200 miles from the place he was born. He never commanded a great army and never won any wars - for he opposed violence.

Since then, many centuries have come and gone...

All armies ever to have marched, all ships ever to have sailed the seas, all parliaments that ever sat, all kings that ever reigned, ... have not had such a profound influence on the people of this planet as did this carpenter's life. This feast marks the end of the Church's year. We then commence the season of Advent the following weekend.

We are committed to implementing innovative and highly effective, evidence-based teaching and learning strategies and resources to ensure that all students achieve their personal best. SWIMMING LESSONS 2015

As part of the Physical Education programme, **all** children in **Years One to Six** will be attending **compulsory** swimming lessons at the Riverton Leisureplex beginning on **Monday 23rd November and concluding Friday 4th December 2015. This Year all classes from Year One to Year Six will have ten 35min lessons.**

Students will be bused to and from the Riverton Leisureplex under the supervision of their class teachers. Lessons will be conducted by qualified instructors, using the Royal Lifesaving Vacswim stages.

Each child is required to have bathers (worn under uniform to school each day), a towel and a pair of slip-on footwear (**to be worn to and from the pool only**) for each lesson. Goggles are optional, but highly recommended. All items are to be carried to and from the pool **in a clearly labelled swimming or plastic bag.**

PLEASE clearly label every item of clothing including bathers, towel, goggles, shoes, socks and underwear. We cannot be responsible for lost items of clothing.

The students are not allowed to wear thongs / flip flops to school.

Children will change into their slip-on footwear before they leave for the pool and put their uniform footwear on when they return to school.
