We hope that the Heads of Agreement which must be signed by the Archbishop and endorsed by Catholic Education Office can move forward so we can complete a shared use agreement. However, we will need to continue to work on the water issue and bore water lease which appears to be slowing things down and unfortunately this is out of our control. addressed by both external parties for us to move forward. We are all hoping that 2020 is the year of the Oval.
