The 1-1 Ipads for our years four, five and six students and the use of ipads for all our junior students ensure that technology is indeed a relevant tool to support learning at Mater Christi, preparing our students for high school and life. When speaking with Leo Di Gregorio, Principal of Emmanuel College, he always affirms the preparedness of our Year Six students for high school, their achievements, can do positive attitude and willingness to be of service. He used the phrase, 'They are a standout'.

Our balanced curriculum allows our students to enjoy a multitude of learning experiences. The classroom-based programs are enhanced with Drama, Italian language and culture, Music, Physical Education and Science classes. 2021 has again included highlights such as the Sacraments of First Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation and year level assemblies. In addition, students took part in activities such as The One Voice Concert at the Perth Arena,
