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Year 6 Camp

What did you try hard at today? What will you do to challenge yourself today? What will you do to improve your work/talent?

These are also great questions for us as adults to reflect on and use during our day.

Criminal Law Amendment (Intimate Images) Bill

In last week's newsletter, you will have read information about the passing of the State Parliament Criminal Law Amendment (Intimate Images) Bill, making it illegal to distribute an intimate image of a person without consent.

As young people under the age of 16 are not exempt from this new offence, it is imperative that information regarding these new laws is shared with our students and their parents. The Department of Justice has provided the following resource for parents

 - $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Parents are to use the inside toilets. The outdoor toilets are for students.

- Please ensure children wear their sports uniform on top of their bathers and have warm clothing available.
