It is with great sadness that I announce to our school community, that Mr Mark de Kluyver, our Principal, has tendered his resignation. Mark has accepted a Principal's position with Holy Rosary School in Doubleview.

Over the last seven years we have seen Mark transform Mater Christi into a strong Catholic Primary School which is the envy of so many other schools throughout Western Australia. Some of Marks' significant achievements have included:

- promoting a student focused primary school;
- the strong support of the Making Jesus Real and Quality Catholic schooling programs;
- · providing unwavering support for the Parish based sacramental program;
- · improved Naplan results across the school population each year;
- recruiting and challenging a very impressive list of assistant principals, teaching, support and administration staff;
- guiding/supporting staff and students through the implementation of a new IT strategy with Apple computers;
- maintaining student numbers in the face of strong competition from other schools:
- prudently managing the school's finances to ensure students have every possible resource available and that the school has adequate cash reserves for the future

Mark is currently the President of the Catholic Primary Principals Association of WA, which we as a school community have all been very proud.

Mark has indicated he will finish with Mater Christi at the end of term one in order to commence his new role at the start of term two. 3rd Week of Lent – Project Compassion – brings you Karen's story

Karen is a First Australian living in a remote rural community. Like many she can't always afford or access healthy food. At the Centacare Wilcannia-Forbes Manage Your Income, Manage Your Life Program, supported by Caritas Australia, Karen gained the skills she needed to budget and choose healthy food for her family.

For the majority of Australians, good health and great food are part of everyday life. But the story is starkly different for First Australians living in rural communities, where low incomes, limited access to nutritious, affordable food, and poor food choices (due to lack of education) are severely compromising the health and well-being of families.

In Central New South Wales, sole mother-of-six Karen had limited education in life-skills such as money management, cooking, nutrition and health. Food and groceries in remote communities like Karen's are expensive due to freight costs and limited local competition. As a result, it was very hard to stretch her Centrelink payments to afford essentials like food and rent.

Karen had never linked good budgeting habits to good food, good health and a better (less stressful) life. So, two years ago, when she enrolled in the Centacare Wilcannia-Forbes Manage Your Income, Manage Your Life Program supported by Caritas Australia, a new world opened up to her. Through a series of budgeting workshops and monthly budget planning sessions, combined with nutrition workshops and cooking activities, Karen gained the tools she needed to take control of her money and budget so she could provide regular, healthy food for her family.

Centacare also introduced Karen to the Food Support Program, where people on low incomes can buy affordable groceries and make their dollars go further. Taking control of her finances, and learning a new range of life-skills has given Karen the ability and confidence to choose foods for a healthier life that will lead to a better future for her family.

- For a quick start, just click on ORDER in the top menu or REGISTER first to save your details for next time
- Select your school and your child's class (all classes can be found on the drop down list Kindy and PP are down the bottom of the list)
- Add your child's first name and last initial (so the school knows who the book is for)
- Enter the item number from the Book Club brochure
- You can order for multiple children at once if they attend the same school
- All orders are linked directly to the school for submission to Scholastic. Books will still be delivered to your child's classroom if you order by the close date
- There's no need to return paper order forms or payment receipt details to your school!

Friendly schools Plus - Resilience

Our school is continuing to create a friendly and supportive culture. The resources we are using are based on evidence from 12 years of empirical research from the Child Health Promotion Research Centre. The resource materials aim to help schools to encourage positive social behaviour and reduce bullying behaviour.

Our goals for a supportive school culture:

- To continue to provide all students with opportunities to develop and practice getting along with other children through classroom learning activities
- Create a positive social environment within our school, which actively discourages bullying.
- Continue to encourage staff, students and parents to treat all school community members with respect, care and compassion

Families' role in creating a supportive school culture

Research demonstrates that efforts to change the attitudes and behaviour of students are more likely to be successful if families are actively involved and share a sense of ownership over the process.

- Talk regularly with your children about what might be happening at school
- Encourage your children to 'ask for help' if they are being bullied at school or someone is being unkind
- If your children are fighting at home, help them discuss their problem and come to a mutual solution
- Encourage your children to be assertive by helping them to practice speaking in a firm but friendly way, making eye contact, looking calm and smiling and feeling good about themselves

Our Resiliency programme is a priority and we will continue to help students develop strategies to prevent bullying as well as developing social skills and resiliency factors.

DEALING WITH ISSUES

Two matters regarding issues between children have recently come to my attention. Our response has always been that, if an issue between children takes place at school, that school staff deal with it, and contact parents/guardians if they believe it needs to be followed up.

Our children know that they need to tell us on the day if there is an issue, in order for staff to address the issue and get the full picture, which only comes from speaking to all parties concerned.

I believe that most people really get that, and respect the process. However, in these two recent issues, despite staff addressing matters very effectively and keeping them in perspective, outside of school blame has been apportioned, with texts and emails flying about between parents, with the result that the issues have become distorted, become bigger than Ben Hur, made a mess of friendships, and made children more anxious.

Please - it is not worth it. Stick to the process. Trust the process. It works. It is honourable, it is Making Jesus Real.
