Overseas Travel

All families received a letter from me yesterday relating to international travel, including Bali. If you have not received this letter, please contact the school to ensure that your contact details are up to date.

Mater Christi teachers are working on designing curriculum lessons for the students, in the very likelihood of school closure to minimise disruption to learning. By the end of this week you will be notified on how this home learning and delivery of curriculum content will be distributed as well as the procedures that will be in place for an early close including how we will communicate with you and how/where you will be able to collect your child/ren from school. We will continue to monitor upcoming school activities and determine the need for postponement or modification to an event e.g. Year 5 Assembly, Holy Week Reflection, EduDance and the Interschool Swimming Carnival.

Thank you to the parents who have notified the School of their overseas travel during the April School Holidays. I'm also aware that some families have begun to cancel planned/booked holidays during the next three months. Please ensure that you keep us notified of any changes.

Our school is working closely with Catholic Education WA, in consultation with the Health Department and is taking all reasonable measures to prevent the spread of the virus at school.

It is important to acknowledge that it can be normal to feel worried or anxious about this situation, parents and children alike. If your children are worried about this virus, you can help them by providing reassurance and perspective – it is unlikely that they will get sick, but if they do, they will go to the doctor. Most children have mild symptoms and feel well again soon. Also remember that speaking with them about increased handwashing, covering their mouth when coughing, sneezing into their elbow and general good hygiene practices will help them feel empowered in this time.

Please keep in mind that we all have an important part to play in promoting good hygiene and public health messages with our students and families that will help contain the spread of this virus and protect those in the community who are at the greatest risk.

Making Jesus Real

Last week as a part of Project Compassion Appeal students learnt about Phany (pronounced Parn-ee). In Cambodia, 1 in 8 people live below the poverty line. Struggling to earn a living as a farmer in Cambodia, Phany was forced to leave her daughter behind in the village to take up construction work in the city.

Thankfully, through a Caritas funded program, Phany learnt new farming techniques which enabled her to get a better yield from her vegetable crops and to conserve water in her drought-stricken region. Phany's community also took part in training in health, nutrition, hygiene and disaster preparedness, arming them with better strategies to cope with environmental changes.

Harmony Week

Mater Christi's Harmony Week celebrations began at Friday's assembly by sharing a video of some of our classmates speaking in different languages. The harmony gov website defines Harmony Week as a "time to celebrate Australia's multiculturalism...Australia is one of the most successful multicultural countries in the world and ... is about inclusiveness, respect and belonging for all Australians, regardless of cultural or linguistic background, united by a set of core Australian values."

Each class will receive a paper crane that will be placed on their prayer tables as a sign of peace. On **Friday the 20th of March** students are invited to wear the colour orange to school. This could be as small as a scrunchie or pair of socks with their sports uniform or they may choose to wear an orange top with their sports shorts or orange shorts. Sport shoes must be worn.

On this Harmony Day, we ask the students to donate a gold coin to their class Project Compassion box. Money collected through Project Compassion is one way the children can assist helping those in our community belong and be empowered with the help they need through Caritas.

Why the colour orange? The colour is the colour chosen to represent Harmony Week. Traditionally the colour orange signifies social communication, meaningful conversation, freedom of ideas and mutual respect. Wearing something orange during Harmony Week shows our support for cultural diversity and inclusivity.

Time will be allocated for children to work with their buddy class to create a badge that promotes the importance of Harmony Week and to get outside to play some different games from around the world. We will share some of the creations and highlights in next week's newsletter!

Here are some interesting facts about Australia's cultural diversity:

- nearly half (49 per cent) of Australians were born overseas or have at least one parent who was
- since 1945, more than 7.5 million people have migrated to Australia
- 85 per cent of Australians agree multiculturalism has been good for Australia
- apart from English, the most common languages spoken in Australia are Mandarin, Arabic, Cantonese, Vietnamese, Italian, Greek, Tagalog/Filipino, Hindi, Spanish and Punjabi
- more than 70 Indigenous languages are spoken in Australia


What's Happening in Year 3
