In other words, it is business as usual with regard to teaching and learning until we hear otherwise.

Classroom teachers, specialists and support staff have been working on our **Curriculum Continuity Plan** Kindy -Year 6 in the event of a temporary school closure. This Plan will be delivered via SeeSaw and you will be able to communicate with your child's teacher via SeeSaw during this time. I am aware that the extent to which this Plan may be used will be determined by each family's context as well as connectivity to the internet at home. The School will continue to communicate with families via SEQTA and email.

In the likelihood of an evacuation and/or early close (e.g. fire not just COVID-19), all students will assemble in the Mater Christi Community Centre (MCCPS). 3-Year-Old students (Tuesday only) will remain in the Early Learning Centre (ELC). Families will receive an SMS via SEQTA.

All families are to adhere to the EVACUATION DRIVE THROUGH PROCEDURES. The map clearly displays the one-way traffic for student/s pick up.

Kindy – Year 6

- 1. No parent will be able to park or get out of their vehicle.
- 2. All cars enter via the Main Entry to the School, taking the first right (against the ordinary flow of traffic). Display your family name as per drive through.
- 3. Students will be called from the Mater Christi Community Centre (MCCPS) and go to the drive through pick up area (see map). There will be 4 points for pick up (1, 2, 3, 4).
- 4. Once you have collected your child/children, continue around the MCCPS as per the map and take a sharp right into the daily drive through (bollards will be down) and left onto Yangebup Rd.

3-Year-Old Students

- 1. All cars enter via the Main Entry to the School.
- 2. Display your BLUE ELC CARD as per drive through.
- 3. A traffic warden will direct you to park your vehicle in the School Carpark.
- 4. Once you have collected your child/ren carefully merge into the traffic line take a sharp right into the daily drive through (bollards will be down) and left onto Yangebup Rd.

NAPLAN



Education Ministers met today and decided that NAPLAN will not proceed in 2020. The NAPLAN test window was scheduled to be held from 12 to 22 May.

The decision to not proceed with NAPLAN in 2020 has been taken to assist school leaders, teachers and support staff to focus on the wellbeing of students and continuity of education, including potential online and remote learning.

I ask parents to continue to maintain a positive outlook for your children and know that for all staff at Mater Christi, the safety and wellbeing of everyone one of our students is our highest priority. Thank you for your continued support in all that we do and ask of you.

Interschool Cricket Carnival

The annual C.P.S.S.A Interschool Cricket Carnival was held on Monday 16th March this week. Mater Christi had four teams competing: two girls' teams and two boys' teams. There was a different feeling to things this year as the Carnival had been moved from its normal Term 4 timeslot and we had not been able to train as much as we would have liked due to distractions such as camp, public holidays and the swimming carnival. We were still ready for action! The tournament consisted of three round robin games. Places were determined by win/loss and the overall aggregate of runs.

All the Mater Christi teams ended up playing the same three schools. We played against Star of the Sea, our cross-town rivals St. Jerome's and new opponents in South Coast Baptist College. The girls started in a blaze of glory winning a close one by 5 runs against derby rivals St. Jerome's. The other two games were blow outs, with the girls showing some real talent to win them both with some big scores. The three wins gave the girls a shot at the title. No other school won all three games, so the A Girls won the silverware, backing up the title they won last year.

B Girls

Despite the lack of experience playing cricket, these girls showed some real pluck. They were unlucky to be beaten in their first game by nine runs after restricting St. Jerome's to a gettable total. The girls were fired up to win the next one but came up short by nine runs again. This was a tough loss to take. So close, yet so far. The third game proved to be the toughest. The girls from South Coast put on an absolute clinic with a massive score. The girls toiled away but couldn't put the runs on the board. They did however, have a ball during the day.

A Boys

The boys were confident of a good showing against all comers after doing well last year. The boys batted first and put a respectable 124 runs on the board. They seemed to be cruising to a victory until a few brain fades and some sloppy bowling meant their opponent snuck in to win by three runs.
