Sunday's Gospel shows us how the first community of disciples came to believe that Jesus had risen from the dead. In these stories we gain insight into how the community of the Church came to be formed. When we read the Gospel, we may be surprised to learn that these friends of Jesus could walk and converse with him at some length yet not recognize him. Again we discover that the risen Jesus is not always easily recognized. Cleopas and the other disciple walk with a person whom they believe to be a stranger; only later do they discover that the stranger is Jesus. We learn that the first community met and recognized Jesus in the breaking of the bread, just as we meet Jesus in the Eucharist. NAPLAN ONLINE 2017



You may have heard that the implementation of NAPLAN Online has now been deferred to 2018, with an aim for all schools to be administering NAPLAN Online by 2019.

It was recently determined that the technical systems required for NAPLAN Online testing were not yet ready and there was a risk that problems could arise during the assessment period.

The decision was made with the best interests of students in mind.

We value and appreciate the efforts of our teachers and support staff in preparing our students for the online transition. This leaves us well prepared for the 2018 implementation of NAPLAN Online.

NAPLAN 2017 tests will be carried out with pen and paper as they have been in previous years.

Safeguarding Protective Behaviours - Parent Workshop

The Perth Catholic Archdiocese Safeguarding Project is child focused and informed by a fundamental belief that children have the right to physical and psychological safety at all times.

One way in which parents can assist in increasing their child's safety is by teaching them in the Protective Behaviours Program. This workshop has been designed to teach parents and carers how to increase the personal safety of their children. Whilst there are many ways of talking to children about their personal safety, it is important that we do not leave them feeling unsafe or afraid. Teaching the Protective Behaviours Program provides children with strategies to keep themselves safe and cope with situations that may threaten their personal safety and wellbeing. This program empowers the individual with the right to feel safe and sets out ways in which they can gain the appropriate help when they are not feeling safe. Purpose of the workshop is to: 1) Provide parents and carers with a basic understanding of child sexual abuse and other unsafe situations. 2) Provide specific personal safety training skills, techniques and examples to use with children. 3) Lessen anxiety about your children's safety so you can allow them freedom of movement as they grow up.

SunSmart Policy Update

Mater Christi continues to be a SunSmart school through the cooler months of the year. In Perth the UV index is greater than 3 between the months of August through to May which mean sun protection is still required. Children are required to have a hat on for outdoor play all year round and sunscreen is to be applied before school. Sunscreen pumps are provided by the P&F for children to access in each classroom. It is recommended that you encourage your children to independently apply their own superscent before school and staff will direct shildren to reapply superscent before school and staff will direct shildren to access in each classroom. Allergy Aware

In 2017 we have students in our school with severe nut allergies. Touching these items, as well as ingestion, may provoke a reaction. Due to the seriousness of this allergy, we are asking you to refrain from sending nut based products to school for recess, lunch and birthday treats.

Appropriate steps have been put in place to ensure Mater Christi is a safe place for all our students. We ask that you also take the time to talk to your child about the following tips to help decrease the risk of any student having an allergic reaction. These include:

not sharing food

• washing their hands before and after eating since some students can have reactions on contact (such as a doorknob, playground equipment, computer etc).

• avoid bringing foods to school that most often cause an allergic reaction eg nuts and nut based products.

We thank you in advance and we appreciate your cooperation in making our school a happy and safe environment for everyone.

School Attendance - Absentees

If your child will be absent or late to school, it is important to ring the school office on 9417 5756 or email us **absentee@mcps.wa.edu.au** before 9am. All messages or emails should include the child's full name, class and reason for absence. Any student arriving after 8.45 must come to the office to sign in before going to class.

If the school has not been contacted by 9.30am an SMS will be sent to your mobile number requesting you to contact the school to explain the absence.

It is a legal requirement that the school receives a signed note for all student absences, therefore if an email has not been sent we will require a note upon your child's return to school. For extended absences such as holidays, please visit the office to complete a pink Leave of Absence Form.

Collecting Students During School Hours

If you need to collect your child during school hours to attend an appointment, you need to go to the office first to sign out the child/ren. The Student Release Form then needs to be given to the class teacher before the child will be released. If you are arranging for someone other than a parent/authorised guardian to collect the student, this person needs to come into the school office with a signed note that states they are authorised to collect the student. If you know in advance that you will be collecting your child, please let the class teacher know in the morning.

After School Pick Up

All children who are not walking, cycling or being picked up at the classroom at 3.05pm will need to go to the undercover area where they will be supervised by the teachers on duty. Other arrangements with after school care providers are fine. Please do not ask your children to wait for you in a different location.

If you do not wish to use the drive through area, please park your vehicle and collect your children from the undercover area.

All children must be collected from the school grounds by 3.30pm.

If you are running late, please make alternative arrangements to have your child collected.

Parking

Thank you for remembering to reverse park! It is the safest option. Parking information is on the school website. If you have a towbar, please try to reverse park short of the brick paving on the oval side, so that walkers can get safely past your vehicle. The oval will be open next week as well, until more people start using the drive through. Please do **not** park on the grass or paving around the school.

Punctuality

For Pre Primary to Year Six students school lobbies open at 8.30am. Please make every effort to have children in class on time ready to start the day by 8.45am. Being settled can and does make a significant difference to what your child gets out of their day. It is also important in order that the teaching and learning programme for the children already there is not disrupted.
