#### **FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER3**

John 10:1-10

Jesus is the gate for his sheep

In the gospel, the relationship between the sheep and their shepherd is based on familiarity. Sheep recognise their shepherd and will not follow a stranger. At the end of the day, shepherds lead their sheep from pastures to a common gated area called a sheepfold. There, one shepherd protects all of the sheep until the next day when each shepherd returns to lead his own sheep to pasture. As shepherds move among the sheep, the sheep follow only their shepherd.

Jesus, the shepherd knows his sheep, and they know him.

#### **NAPLAN**

Students in Years 3 and 5 will sit for the National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) test on May 9th/10th/11th this year. Students will complete four tests covering numeracy, reading, writing and language conventions (spelling, punctuation and grammar). The NAPLAN test results and the student reports are released late Term Three.

The results provide information about student achievement that is used to inform teaching and learning programs. NAPLAN tests provide point-in-time information regarding student progress in literacy and numeracy and are intended to complement the wide range of formal and informal assessments that the teachers already use.

#### How best to support your child/ren during NAPLAN-

Ensure they have a good night's sleep.

Give them a solid healthy breakfast - but don't overload them.

Encourage fresh air and fun play after school.

Children pick up cues from us - so keep it low key. The test will cover normal classroom/curriculum learnings acquired over a period of time.

Encourage your child to do their best. Emphasise that this is one of many tests they will have during their schooling, and is designed to help them learn more effectively.

Most of all, reassure them that you are proud of them for who they are and not what they can do. No test can ever measure a person's worth.

The following graphic reminds all of us, especially when we hear and read discussions and articles about testing children, there are many important qualities that standardised testing cannot measure.

#### Safeguarding Protective Behaviours – Parent Workshop

The Perth Catholic Archdiocese Safeguarding Project is child focused and informed by a fundamental belief that children have the right to physical and psychological safety at all times.

One way in which parents can assist in increasing their child's safety is by teaching them in the Protective Behaviours Program. This workshop has been designed to teach parents and carers how to increase the personal safety of their children. Whilst there are many ways of talking to children about their personal safety, it is important that we do not leave them feeling unsafe or afraid. Teaching the Protective Behaviours Program provides children with strategies to keep themselves safe and cope with situations that may threaten their personal safety and wellbeing. This program empowers the individual with the right to feel safe and sets out ways in which they can gain the appropriate help when they are not feeling safe. Purpose of the workshop is to: 1) Provide parents and carers with a basic understanding of child sexual abuse and other unsafe situations. 2) Provide specific personal safety training skills, techniques and examples to use with children. 3) Lessen anxiety about your children's safety so you can allow them freedom of movement as they grow up.

#### YEAR ONE

Welcome back to a busy and exciting term in Year One.



In Literacy, we are exploring a variety of different text types, working on our reading comprehension skills and continuing to practise sentence structure. Our key focus in Numeracy will be enhancing our mental maths skills through a range of strategies. We will also be exploring time and money.

In History, we will be rolling back the clock to experience what life was like in the past and how things have changed. We have kicked this exploration off with a 1950s themed 50th day of school. In Religious Education this term, we will be learning about God's creation and exploring how to make choices that show love for others. We are looking forward to the excitement that this term will bring! Thank you for your ongoing support.

#### YEAR TWO

Welcome back everyone to what will be another busy and exciting term. In English we will be exploring fairy tales and learning how to write narratives and expositions. We will start the term off learning about multiplication and division in Math, then we will be covering Measurement and Geometry in the second half of the term. In our inquiry program, students will have the opportunity to investigate communities and how they shape our society. During Religion we will be doing the unit Beautiful World, Beautiful Me in the first half of the term. This unit explores the beauty of creation and the Sacrament of Baptism. We will then work on the unit Gathered Together, which teaches us about the importance of Church and coming together as a community of faith. We are excited for our fairytale day during wellness week, start getting those costumes ready!

#### YEAR THREE

Term Two is time for the Year Three students to cook up a storm as they discover how to write procedures and develop description in their writing. They will continue to build their knowledge of reading comprehension skills, through guided reading activities. Religious Education this term takes students on a discovery of what the true meaning of sin is and how we can show love to others, along with understanding why we receive Communion. In Maths we will continue to work on Number and our Times Tables. Money, Time and

Measurement will also be a focus this term. We look forward to an exciting and busy term ahead!

#### **YEAR FOUR**

In Year Four this term we start to kick things up a notch! After a leisurely two weeks off, students start to get a taste of the demands of senior school students. Religious Education units this term include 'Creator of Human Life', a unit that explores the human soul and our connection to God, and 'The Spirit Who Strengthens', a unit that helps students understand what it means to receive their First Holy Communion. In Literacy, students are learning how to write procedural texts, including how to bake cakes, butter bread and take a walk to the shops without getting lost. Students will also be getting their first taste of public speaking for the year, preparing a presentation on a topic of their choice to present to the class. In Mathematics, students are exploring the world of Statistics, interpreting and creating a range of graphs of varying types. They will also



explore the properties of 2D and 3D shapes and develop their mathematical language to accurately describe them. In number, we will be focusing on the concept of multiplication and the reciprocal relationship of division facts. HASS sees students finishing off the Environments topic before looking at Political and Legal systems. In Health, we will explore bullying and conflict resolution to assist in the building and maintaining of relationships. We look forward to a busy, yet rewarding term and can't wait to see what students achieve before the mid-point of the year.

#### YEAR FIVE



Welcome back to Term Two. We hope you had an enjoyable and relaxing holiday. This term we are very excited about our Market Day. The children will be running stalls in groups, selling products which they will design and make. The Market will be held on Thursday, June 15 during recess and lunch. On Tuesday, June 13, representatives from the Commonwealth Bank will visit us to talk about their StartSmart program to help teach us more about money and how to save. A future entrepreneur may lie within!! In Literacy our main focus is Poetry. We will be reading, analyzing and writing some wonderful poems. Our Religion topics for Term Two are 'All Creation Give Thanks' and 'Relationships Restored'. It all makes for a very busy but amazing term!

#### YEAR SIX

Welcome back to school for Term Two. We hope everyone is refreshed and ready for what promises to be a very busy term. In Religious Education, we will explore The Sacraments of Initiation, with a focus on Confirmation and Eucharist. Many Year Sixes will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation this term and we ask that you keep them in your prayers. During Literacy Dedicated Time, we will examine narrative features and continue to explore the use of figurative language. This will see us writing some captivating short stories and fractured fairytales. We will also be reading the novel 'Boy Overboard' in shared reading, with a continued focus on Margaret Menner's reading comprehension strategies.

Our Numeracy Dedicated Time will see the Year Six students exploring the Measurement and Geometry strand with a focus on the 'Cartesian Coordinate System', angles and transformations. This term will also give all students the opportunity to apply their mathematical knowledge to inquiry-based tasks.

Additionally, in Health we will learn about our relationships and how we can better manage time and conflict with our special guest teacher Mrs Rowland. In HASS the focus is Migration and Democracy. We are all very excited to take out first look at coding, using our new Sphero robots. This term is action packed with events! We have our assembly to look forward to and the Lightning, Cross Country and Interschool Carnivals. Hold on tight, it's going to fly by!



#### **MUSIC**

Welcome back to another term of Music with Ms Ross. This term, students will continue to learn about a variety of musical elements and skills. Pre-Primary and Year 1 will focus on beat, rhythm, pitch and dynamics. Year 2 and 3 will focus on beat, rhythm, pitch and tempo. Students in Year 4, 5 and 6 will continue to read, compose and perform songs using our percussion instruments.



#### **Performing Arts Festival 2017**

Preparations for the 2017 Catholic Performing Arts Festival have started and it looks to be another exciting year for the Arts Department at Mater Christi. Many of our students will be involved in various categories including Choral Singing, Dance, Drama, Choral Speech, Bible Reading, Instrumental Solos and Ensembles. The juniors will continue with the focus of "Creative Play and using our Imagination". The students enjoy and feel very comfortable in the world of make believe! The development of their confidence is certainly evident. Along with this there will be some classes that will have a focus on choral speaking in preparation for the Performing Arts Festival.

The senior focus is on "Readers Theatre", the emphasis is on reading aloud with expression. It builds oral fluency and strengthens reading and language arts skills. It also promotes team work and the group support in this situation is often enough to develop confidence.



This can then lead onto staged performances with props and costumes within the classroom setting and even the stage! It is in this situation where we then develop the skills of performance.

#### Resiliency

- 1. The Friendly Schools Plus resource will continue to be a focus as we teach the students about being resilient and handling challenging situations they may find themselves in. A reminder our aim is to develop the student's social and emotional intelligence and this fosters the prevention of bullying behaviours.
- 2. The M.J.R. (Making Jesus Real) programme will also continue to be a focus throughout the school. MJR has a simple message Jesus is part of our lives and can change the way we live, we can make Jesus real through our daily actions and words. Students learn about having a positive attitude and that their actions, attitudes and behaviours have an impact on their relationships. MJR provides students with a language that allows them to evaluate their thoughts and behaviours and provides strategies for alternative actions. It teaches them about being a welcoming person who encourages others, a person who can say sorry and thank you. Students learn about including people, making eye contact and the importance of forgiveness and gratitude. An important aspect of MJR is learning how to recognise God Moments in our daily life!


