# THE TRINITY

"All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." Matthew 28: 16 – 20.

Any of you who watched the Royal Wedding last week would have perhaps noticed the animated American Reverend talking about the Holy Trinity in his sermon. When it all boils down to it all you need is love! The new commandment given to us by Jesus is to love one another as I have loved you. To do this, last weekend at Pentecost, Jesus provided his Disciples with the Holy Spirit to help them spread this message. At Mass this Sunday we learn about the Trinity, hence we re-enact the Trinity each time we make the sign of the cross. Pentecost and the Holy Trinity are permanent reminders from Jesus that he is with us till the end of time. All you need to do is have faith and love one another.

#### Capital Development Plan – Master Plan



Last year at the AGM, our Master Plan for future development and refurbishment was shared with those present. There was great excitement about the prospect that in the first stage of development our school toilets will be given the much-needed attention they require. The Capital Development Team has been working hard behind the scenes with the architects on their design and presented the initial designs to the School Board.

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#### **PLAN A includes:**

- Remodel and refurbish Kindy toilets
- Refurbish the Year 3/4 toilets
- Refurbish the staff toilets
- Demolish and rebuild the Year 1/2 and Year 5/6 toilets (this creates and opens wider walk-way and the toilets comply within the scope of the Child Safe Framework)
- Construct 2 adult toilets within the school with wheelchair access for parents and visitors to utilise (one with nappy changing capacity)

Catholic Education WA has asked that all schools wanting to submit a Capital Development Plan for any capital works which will require a loan, submission to the City of Cockburn or require the Archbishop of Perth to sign off on the work, to wait until a Working Party that is investigating System Debt has concluded their work and made their recommendations to the Catholic Education Commission WA. What does this mean for Mater Christi? Points 3,4 and 5 will need to be placed on hold for the immediate future until we receive clear direction from Catholic Education WA. This should occur sometime this year. Therefore, we go to Plan B.

#### **Plan B includes:**

- Refurbish the Year 3/4 toilets
- Remodel and refurbish Kindy toilets

We are in the final stages of detailed plans, product choice and costing the scope of works for the refurbishment of the Year 3/4 toilets. Once completed these will be presented to the School Board and then to our community with a timeline of work.

The Kindy toilets will need to be refurbished during the Christmas school holidays as it would be difficult for our youngest students to utilise any other toilets within our school.

The architects are still exploring if building one adult toilet and refurbishing the staff female toilets can occur with no submission required by the City of Cockburn – stay tuned for that.

This is an exciting time for Mater Christi and good things will come to those who are patient and wait that little bit longer.

#### Plenary Council 2020



The Plenary Council to be held in 2020 is a rare opportunity to name and raise issues about our church in Australia. During the next two years we will have an opportunity to share our thoughts about the church in Australia particularly in Perth. The results from the Plenary Council will shape the direction of the church beyond 2020.

Many of you will be well aware of the fact that the Australian church at present is under an enormous strain due to issues that have arisen recently. Even with this strain, Modern Australian society would simply not function without our church agencies providing services in education, health and charity. As at 2018, 1 in 5 Australian children are educated in the Catholic system. The last time the Catholic Church in Australia held a Plenary Council was in 1937. It has been more than 80 years since we gathered all of the Church together and much has changed.

Our Plenary Council 2020 is being held so that we can dialogue about the future of the Catholic Church in Australia.
