When trying to explain the Trinity to children, we often use a cloverleaf – one leaf but three parts. These are inadequate examples as the Trinity is really beyond our understanding, but they do help a little. It is one of the many things in our Catholic religion, where faith helps our understanding.

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Moving Forward

The last few months have been different and challenging for everyone. In acknowledging this, we are choosing to concentrate on the many varied positive opportunities provided, including the incredible way our children, little ones, in particular, have managed to navigate their way through the morning drop off and afternoon pick-up - and generally thrive.

Mater Christi staff have noted the following in recent weeks:

- Children are more focused and ready for learning.
- The start of the day is calmer.
- Children are showing independence through simple tasks like carrying their bag, unpacking and packing items, and placing their bag in the correct place this is flowing over into the classroom and playground.
- Children are maturing and developing greater resiliency.
- Friendships are being nurtured in the time between drop-off and heading into class.
- Learning time starts on time.

What have our children gained?

Self-regulation & Resilience: Research shows that it is essential for children to strive for independence through small daily tasks. Our children require opportunities to experience new and possibly challenging things to assist them in developing self-regulation and self-resilience.

Self-esteem: Greater self-reliance involves higher self-esteem. This is how our children evolve and grow into healthy adults, working through challenges, and seeing the possibilities.

Intrinsic Motivation/overcome fear of failure/deal with stress effectively: We all want to nurture and develop independent children. As we know, independence promotes intrinsic motivation and enhances self-esteem. It assists children in handling and overcoming a fear of failure and enables them to deal with stress effectively.

Emotional Maturity/Decision Making: Independence develops children's emotional maturity. It allows them to become good decision-makers and provides them with the belief they are competent and capable of taking care of themselves.

We have all come so far and do not want to lose the momentum we have gained. Therefore, we are asking parents to assist us and ensure continuity moving forward.

PHASE 3 Guidelines effective Monday 8 June

Assemblies and school community events

Assemblies and other school community events may recommence with total not exceeding 100 people for indoor settings and not exceeding 300 people in outdoor settings. For the rest of Term Two there will be no Assemblies due to each year having 90 students. Our Student Councillors are working on a virtual Assembly later this term for year levels to access from their classrooms.

Playgrounds

Students will be able to access the oval play equipment during recess and lunch. These and the internal play areas will be sprayed once a day.





Sport

Interschool sports can occur with a total not exceeding 100 people for indoor settings or 300 people for outdoor settings. Mr Donnelly will provide further clarifications in regard to Mater Christi's Cross Country, Lightning Carnival and Interschool Cross Country.

School meetings

School Boards, Parents & Friends and staff meetings can resume during school hours and after hours for up to 100 people when adhering to physical distancing. Parents are invited to the next P&F Meeting on Friday 12 June at 9am in the Mater Christi Community Centre.

Access to School

Families are allowed onto school grounds to drop off and collect their children, adhering to the 2m physical distancing rule. Therefore, I ask that you do not gather within the school grounds before dropping off/collecting your child. Families do not enter classrooms/lobbies at the beginning or end of the day. You can come into the school grounds to drop off and pick up your children, speak with Office Staff, drop off/pick up students for appointments, or if they are unwell.

Drop Off – Years 1-6 students

Families can use drive-through as usual.

Families may park in the school carpark. To assist in managing the traffic into Yangebup Rd and in being respectful to other drivers e.g., Divine Mercy parents, Montessori parents, and residents, if parking - only enter

and exit from Pioneer drive.

Students arriving before 8.30 am – kiss and drop on the grassed area between the Library and Undercover area. Students arriving between 8.30 am – 8.45 am – kiss and drop at the classroom/lobby door. Parents do not enter classrooms/lobbies.

Students arriving after 8.45 am, come to the Office for a late note.

Drop Off – Kindy/Pre-Primary students

Families may park in the school grounds. To assist in managing the traffic into Yangebup Rd and in being respectful to other drivers e.g., Divine Mercy parents, Montessori parents, and residents - only enter and exit from Pioneer drive. In school, Kindy and Pre-Primary gates will open at 8.30 am.

Students arriving between 8.30 am – 8.45 am – kiss and drop at the classroom door. Parents do not enter classrooms/lobbies.

Students arriving after 8.45 am come to the Office for a late note.

Pick Up – Years 1-6 students

Drive through as normal – 3.05 pm.

Enter and exit from Pioneer drive only if you are parking. Collect students from Junior and Senior Courtyards (paved area with a large tree in the middle of a circular garden bed). Parents do not enter classrooms/lobbies.

Pick Up – Kindy/Pre-Primary students

Enter and exit from Pioneer drive only.

Park and collect students. Gates will open at 3.05 pm. Parents do not enter classrooms/lobbies.

Walkers

Enter and Exit the school via path between Year Six classrooms and Before/After School Care.

3-Year-Old Students

Enter and exit from Pioneer drive only.

Park and drop off/collect students from ECE gate. Gate will open 9 am and 3 pm. Parents do not enter classrooms.
