Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to Term Three amidst celebrations of the 50th year since the moon landing. Next weekend begins the first of three weekends with many of our Year Four children receiving their First Eucharist. Did you know that there was a FIRST EUCHARIST ON THE MOON? It would have been impossible to miss the 50th anniversary of the Lunar Landing over the past week or so. It was such a historical landmark – such a "first" experience for mankind (especially for those of us old enough to remember that black and white transmission – even if we were extremely young). What you may not have heard much about, was that while Armstrong and Aldrin waited to walk on the moon, Buzz Aldrin took Holy Communion. It was not announced publicly (NASA had been sued after the Apollo 8 astronauts read from the Book of Genesis!) but Aldrin spoke to the world saying,



"I would like to take this opportunity to ask every person listening in, whoever and wherever they may be, to pause for a moment and contemplate the events of the past few hours and to give thanks in his or her own way."

He then took the body and blood which he had been given to him by his church. In later years, Aldrin wondered if there was another way of commemorating the moment - when they were on the moon in the name of all mankind – regardless of their race or religion – but said that at the time he couldn't think of a better way to give thanks to God than to celebrate Eucharist.

Term Three is a time for new learning and experiences and exciting community events. I look forward to your involvement with us.

#### **Sustainability News**

#### **Sacrament of First Holy Communion**

We hold the students in Year 4 who will be undertaking the Sacrament of First Holy Communion in our prayers as they continue to prepare for receiving their first Eucharist. #### **NAIDOC Week**

NAIDOC Week occurs on the 7-14th of July. NAIDOC celebrations are held across Australia each July to celebrate the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. NAIDOC is celebrated not only in Indigenous communities, but by Australians from all walks of life. As this week occurred over the holidays, Mater Christi participated in a range of activities to support our local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community during the first week back. On Tuesday the 23rd of July, the Year 2 and 4 classes were fortunate enough to participate in an incursion with Greg Nannup from Indigenous Tours WA. During this presentation, the children learnt about local history, listened to a Dreaming story and explored different artefacts, tools and plants. In addition to this, each class listened to the Dreamingstory called 'The Rainbow Serpent'. Children were provided with a template of a serpent which they decorated in Aboriginal symbols and various art techniques. You can see what the children created on our lobby doors. Some classes also discussed the importance of an Acknowledgement of Country. An Acknowledgement to Country is a way of paying respects to the Traditional Owners and ongoing custodians of the land (Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people) as is usually made at the commencement of an event. For example, at a meeting. When we say an Acknowledgment of Country at school, we are acknowledging the Whadjuk people of the Beeliar Region. Please note that an Acknowledgement of Country is different to a Welcome to Country. - Did you know that some native fruits that are red can be poisonous? Amber D.
- Did you know if you eat these fruits you can get really sick, or death could occur? Fruits like apples are fine, because they originally came from another country. Isla L.
- Did you know that if you put red fruit under water for two weeks, it removes the poison from the fruit? You will be able to eat it. Jayden P.
- Did you know that in Summer, the Perth tribe travelled to Fremantle for festivals? Children went with the women. Boys over thirteen go with the men. They used branches to catch the fish. Sarah B.
- Did you know if you are going to light a fire, you will need two sticks? Izzy S.
- Did you know that they made a hole in the stick by banging a rock down on a stick? Once you have made your hole, you keep rubbing one stick into the other stick. Friction makes a spark, but you have to keep rubbing until you see smoke. Brooke D.
- Did you know Aboriginal people use to make bags out of kangaroo skins? Hudson R.
- Did you know they made unique clothing out of kangaroo skins? Yuri D.
- Did you know they placed sap from a Eucalyptus tree on the kangaroo skin to help make it soft? Ivy C.
- Did you know when it's raining, and it's cold and they need to keep warm they place the fur on the inside. It is a reversible jacket. Luca P.
- Did you know you can make medicine that can help with eczema? It comes from the Eucalyptus tree. Seth C.
- Did you know you mix water with Eucalyptus sap to make a remedy for eczema? It will take about fourteen days for it to work. Zech Y.


