ELC

Another exciting term in the ELC! We have many new friends come and join us to play and learn with.

This term we will be discussing the topics 'Rights and Responsibilities', 'Growing and Changing' and 'Oceans and Rivers'. Social and emotional skill development will be a priority, including listening to our friends, and teachers, following instructions and, asking and answering questions. In addition, we will explore several concepts

throughout the term, including talking about Making Jesus Real by being like our friend Jesus, name recognition, learning the names of colours, counting skills to 10 and sorting and classifying. Through indoor and outdoor play, the children will be working on developing their gross and fine motor skills.

We look forward to working in partnership with all our families for another happy and fun term.

Wow! Term 3 already. The children have returned with many wonderful stories about their holidays and are eager to be back playing with their friends. This term, the topics will be 'Looking after God's World', 'Growing and Changing' and 'Australia'.

Social and emotional skill development will continue to be a priority, including developing

communication skills, following instructions, how to make good choices and Keeping Ourselves Safe. In addition to this we will also focus on several concepts throughout the term including Making Jesus Real by being like our friend Jesus, learning the sounds of the letters S.A.T.P.I.N and M.R.C.H.E.D, retelling familiar stories, forming letters of the alphabet using Peggy Lego prompts, identifying and ordering numerals 0-10, counting backwards and experimenting with mass and measurement.

Library time has been an exciting addition to our program and the children are enjoying the borrowing of books and their visit to the Library once a week.

We would like to say thank you for helping us by coming on Parent Roster. Your help is appreciated and your children love having you in Kindy.

We look forward to another busy and productive term. We will enjoy sharing the Learning Journey with you in Week 8.

Pre-Primary

Welcome back to an exciting term in Pre-Primary!

Our theme for Term Three will be animals, starting with mini-beasts. In addition to learning about animals, our focus will be on one of our favourite children's authors, Eric Carle!

In Literacy, the children will be working towards becoming independent writers, continuing to strengthen their letter sound knowledge. There will be a strong focus on reading as we learn to read decodable texts and early sight words.

In Religious Education, the children will learn to recognise the different feelings we have and that God wants us to express our feelings in loving ways. They will write their own thank you prayers and also



come to realise that they can talk to God anywhere and anytime.

In Numeracy, the children will be working on their recognition and ordering of numbers beyond 20. They will also be exposed to the language used for addition and subtraction. The children will use concrete objects and hands on activities to identify and explore 2D shapes and 3D objects. This term will be full of excitement as we get ready to perform our first ever Assembly!

Year One

Welcome to Term 3! We have had such an exciting start to the term with celebrating our 100th day of school on Wednesday. In Religion, we will be focusing on how we belong to a family, school, parish and community and how we can use our learning gifts to help others as Jesus did. In English, we are exploring narratives and Dreamtime stories. In addition to this we will be investigating Australia and Australian animals. We will learn how to write information reports and further develop our descriptive writing abilities. During Numeracy, we are learning about different shapes and will explore location and fractions. We will also continue to build on the number of mental strategies we can use to solve equations. We are looking forward to showcasing the amazing work we have been doing at our Learning Journey!

Year Two

Welcome back to Term 3!

We have another exciting term planned. We will be learning about the amazing mini beasts in our environment. We will be discussing technology in our investigations; the children will have fun comparing the technology of today to that of the past. In Literacy, we will be focusing on report writing and poetry. We will be continuing to

teach the Keeping Safe Child Protection Behaviour Curriculum. The topics covered will be privacy and the body, reporting abuse and safe and unsafe secrets. Please note that during these lessons the children will be taught the anatomical names for the parts of the body. During Maths lessons we will be learning about money, fractions and time. The two topics for Religion this term include: 'Jesus Forgives' and 'Beautiful World, Beautiful Me'. We will also have Ms Rebecca Rowland visiting in the second half of the term to continue working on the Highway Heroes program. Don't forget to check Seesaw for updates and information on the exciting things happening this term!



Year Three

Bonjour! Ciao! Guten Tag! G'Day! Dia Dhuit! This term in Year 3 we travel to and explore the different cultural celebrations around the world. In literacy, students will be researching a variety of animal species and this will culminate in students writing an information report on an animal of their choice. In Religious Education we will be looking at the Sacraments of Eucharist and Baptism. In Numeracy, students will learn more about multiplication and division, fractions, symmetry and data. In Health we move our way through the body systems to find out how to maintain a healthy, balanced lifestyle. Integrated with our Literacy and HASS program is Visual Art. Fasten your seatbelts, place your seats in the upright position and enjoy the journey!

Year Four

Term three is a very special time for our Year Four students who are preparing to receive the Sacrament of Communion for the first time this August. In Religion, they are learning how the Eucharist is an invitation to a celebration, in which a meal is shared, much like Jesus shared with his Disciples at The Last Supper. The students will unpack the Book of Exodus, making links between The Last Supper and the celebration of Passover.

In reading the focus continues to be on developing comprehension skills to elicit understanding. The students will be working towards using evidence from a text to support their perspectives and opinions. They will learn to develop critical reading skills and will become more familiar with the topic specific vocabulary used in non-fiction texts. Our writing focus includes narrative and persuasive s we prepare to blow our parents away with stories and expositions for Learning Journey. In Mathematics, the main Number focus this term will be fractions, decimals and percentages. This will include representing parts of a whole as a fraction, recognising



equivalent fractions, as well as converting fractions from improper to a mixed number. In Measurement, the focus will be on telling the time to the minute and calculating elapsed time. In Statistics and Probability, the students will explore the likelihood of both independent and dependent events. In HASS, students will be researching famous explorers and retrace their voyages that changed the world. They also learn about convicts and their importance in the days of European Settlement, culminating in an excursion to the famous Fremantle Prison.

Year Five

Welcome back to Term Three. We hope you had an enjoyable and relaxing holiday. This term we welcome Mr Godsall who will be completing his final teaching practicum in 5B. Our Religion topics for Term Three are 'Prayer' and 'Reconciliation' along with revising for the Bishops Literacy Assessment in Week Three. In English the main focus in Writing is information texts and procedures. In Reading, we will be exploring point of view and enhancing our researching skills. Our Mathematics topics are transformations, fractions and decimals and mapping. In Digital Technologies we will be exploring the concept of coding and will be creating our own maze game using a program called Scratch. We are looking forward to our excursion to Scitech Discovery Centre where we will get a chance to learn more about robotics. In Art we are exploring colour through the creation of a dragon's eye and landscapes. During our HASS lessons, we will be learning about the Gold Rush, Eureka Stockade and the British Colonies in the 1800's. We look forward to showcasing all of our hard work to our parents at the Learning Journey night in Week Eight.

Year Six

Term 3 already? How times flies when you're having fun in Year 6. We have our Year 6 Debate Night, Learning Journey, Family Life Presentations, Life Skills for Life Incursion, Interschool Carnivals and the Performing Arts Festival. In Religious Education we will be studying Prayer and Human Sexuality, whilst brushing up on our Bible skills.

During English we will examine persuasive devices and strategies, which will then lead us into debating. This will culminate in a Debate Night which will be held in Week 10. We would love to see you all there to make this night as memorable as it promises to be. In Mathematics this term, we focus on fractions, decimals and percentages. HASS gives us an opportunity to extend upon our knowledge of people, places and cultures through our Geography unit, focusing on Australia's connection with Asia. In Health, the students will be delving deeper into the Keeping Safe Program, learning about the ways to recognise and report different types of abuse. Semester Two promises to be the best yet and we look forward to some great adventures together. Thank you.

Drama

For many classes this term, the focus is on rehearsals for the Performing Arts Festival. We are involved in Bible Reading, Choral Speech as well as the Christian Drama and Primary Drama sections.

- The junior students will continue to delve into the world of make believe but this term with a focus on puppetry as well as creative play. Through the use of puppets, students can learn new ways to express themselves while learning new skills. This is another way of enhancing listening skills, developing risk-taking skills and providing students with opportunities to work cooperatively as a group and of course this all boosts self-esteem.
- The senior focus is also on puppetry but includes developing the student's script writing ability. Brainstorming ideas, editing and processing their work, in order to perform as a group in front of their peers. Improvisation is also an area that will continue to be a focus. When students are given the opportunity for their imagination to run free, self-esteem and confidence flourish.
- The Friendly Schools Plus programme is an ongoing focus in all year levels, with the key area for this term being 'Relationship Skills.' This is where we look at making friends and maintaining healthy relationships. Dealing effectively with conflicts and seeking help if we are not able to solve a social problem ourselves.

Music

Welcome back to another exciting term of Music!

This term, the Pre-Primary and Year 1 students will be concentrating on beat and creating their own rhythm patterns. Years 2 and 3 will be exploring music notation and playing simple songs on the glockenspiel. Years 4, 5 and 6 will be exploring how to use Timbre to enhance their performances. We will also continue learning about music technologies - specifically Garage Band using the iPads.

Science

Let's get physical, physical! That's right, Term 3 is the term for Physical Science at Mater Christi. Physical Science is the study of different forces and energy and each year group focuses on a different area within this discipline.

Pre-Primary students are exploring how different objects can move. This means looking at what causes things to spin, roll and bounce and involves a lot of movement from the students themselves!





Year 1 are investigating sound and light energy. Students explore

how different sounds can be produced and how these energies travel, as well as how they can be sensed by humans. The lab gets loud while we make our music but it's all in the name of science.

Year 2 students are exploring how pushes and pulls are used in their everyday lives.

While investigating pushes and pulls they will learn about gravity, air resistance and buoyancy.

Year 3 students are learning about heat energy this term. This includes how we generate heat, how we use heat and how heat can travel, with a special emphasis on conduction.

Year 4 start to discover opposites attract while studying their topic of magnetism. They also explore other forces such as gravity and friction using ramps and different surfaces.

Year 5 build on their knowledge gained in Year 1 by furthering their study on energy. This involves them exploring how light travels and how we see different images. They also investigate lights ability to reflect and refract using objects as mirrors.

Year 6 explore how electrical energy can be transformed and transferred by building circuits. They also investigate different ways to generate energy and start debating how these resources impact the environment to varying degrees.

Week 4 is also a special time in Science as it's National Science Week. Students will be completing different STEM challenges and competitions during that week to celebrate. Stay tuned for more news coming soon!

Preparatory Chemistry

Thursdays 4.30 - 6.30 pm

Students are introduced to problem solving and when older are able to study the *Open University Australia* subject Introduction to Chemistry. Students also have the opportunity to train for the Australian Science Olympiads Examination for Chemistry.
