Handbook For Teenagers: This year the Safeguarding Team will be publishing a handbook for older children called "Love, Sex and Relationships – The Basic Essentials for Catholic Teenagers". Mater Christi Parish will host the workshop for parents of teenage children based on this resource. The date planned is Thursday September 6 so pencil that into your calendar. More details next week.

Handbook For Parents of Young Children: Last year's handbook for parents, "Protecting God's Children", was offered as a practical and informative resource to help address the safety of our young children. The associated workshop was in two parts: 1. the dynamics of child sexual abuse and 2. a guide for Catholic parents on keeping their kids safe. Last week in this column we provided some material on the first part and below are some points from part 2.

The 10 Basket Fillers: the following "basket fillers" are what we teach children sequentially in order to increase their safety: *God gave all children the right to feel safe at all times; Feelings and Emotional Intelligence; Early Warning Signs and the Safety Continuum; Nothing is so awful that we can't talk with someone about it; My Helping Hands; My Private Parts; Social Distance; It's OK to Say NO; Secrets; God's Design for Sex.*

To find out more obtain a copy of the handbook from the Safeguarding Team or attend the workshop during Child Protection Week. *The Child Protection Breakfast* is on Tuesday 4 September at 7:30am at the Duxton Hotel and don't forget *Safeguarding Competition* entries are due Sunday August 19. Entry forms are available in the Church Foyer or from the school.


