RoboCup

Last Friday, a group of Year Six students from the Enrichment Program participated in the RoboCup competition. There were 39 teams competing and Mater Christi was one of 16 schools selected for the finals. The students were remarkable in their ability to design, build and program their robots for the Dance category where they had to design and perform a short robot dance show to a piece of music. Congratulations to all the students and Miss McNally for their impressive achievement but more importantly for the way they planned, collaborated, problem solved and persevered during the last few months. It's also wonderful how appreciative our children

are of the opportunities available to them at our school. Below is some further information about the competition.

RoboCup Junior Australia is a project-orientated robotics competition and educational initiative for Australian students who are required to work together to design, build and program robots that can compete in one of three robotic challenges (Dance, Rescue and Soccer). Each team must choose one challenge in which to compete. Robots are built by students, not teachers, with the additional requirement that all robots must feature a unique and original design. RoboCup Junior empowers students to develop and apply their skills across the combined disciplines of Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM). RoboCup Junior has recently been described by the office of the Australian Chief Scientist as the number one STEM competition currently operating in Australia.


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




INTERSCHOOL LEAGUETAG CARNIVAL

Keeping everyone well: School Exclusion Guidelines

The National Health and Medical Research Council guidelines on preventing infectious diseases in early childhood education and care services state the following:

"Due to the close contact of young children, who often put things in their mouth and who do not cover their coughs and sneezes there is a great opportunity for airborne and direct contact transmission of viruses and bacteria".

The most important prevention strategies are to:

- Keep unwell children at home
- Encourage children's cough and sneeze etiquette *cough into your elbow, cover your mouth*
- Effective hand washing and environmental cleaning
- Excluding one ill/infectious person protects many others from becoming ill

Our attempt to reduce children and educators becoming unwell is reliant on all families respecting the **following exclusion guidelines to keep unwell children at home:**

- For at least 24 hrs following the last vomit or diarrhoea
- Until all blisters are dry for chicken pox or hand, foot and mouth
- Whilst a wet cough persists the first 24-48 hrs of a cold when coughing and spraying
- Until a rash has disappeared
- Until a fever has subsided without the use of paracetamol
- If a child has required paracetamol overnight, please consider if they may be well enough to come to school. Please also inform their teacher on arrival.

Parents will be asked to collect children who:

- vomit
- have diarrhoea
- develop a rash or fever or blisters
- have discharging eyes
- are generally unwell

Medication

If your child requires medication whilst in our care, we require you to complete an 'Authorisation Form' obtained from the office or easily printed from the Communication/Policies & Forms page of our school website. **We are unable to administer medication without authorisation.**

Please ensure that you have provided the school with up to date emergency contact numbers and have a back-up plan if your child has to remain home due to illness.

Thank you for your assistance in keeping all children and staff well.

Aim: To provide families with information about bystander roles and responsibilities

Talking with your children about bystanders

Bullying involves more than the students who are bullied and those who bully others. Bullying often continues because people who are involved do not talk about it and seek help. This includes people who observe bullying - the bystanders. A bystander is someone who sees the bullying or knows that it is happening to someone else.

Bullying Situation Chart



There may be bystanders who are afraid they may be bullied next and this may influence their decision about what they will do if they see bullying happening.

> There are different types of bystanders and in this model, they are described as:

Contributors - This group offer support to the person bullying, either by helping the person to bully the other person or by encouraging the person bullying. This group might gather to watch the incident (sometimes from concern for the person being bullied, sometimes to see what will happen, and sometimes for enjoyment).

Supporters - This group dislikes the bullying, is concerned for the person being bullied and actively tries to help the person being bullied.

What can bystanders do?

If students see another student being bullied they should:

- · Ask a teacher or support person for help
- · Let the person doing the bullying know that what they are doing is bullying
- · Refuse to join in with the bullying and walk away
- · Support the student who is being bullied
- · Support their friends and protect them from bullying (children who are alone are more likely to be the target of bullying, so encourage your children to be aware of children who are left out or on their own in the schoolyard)
