Sometimes, I also receive an email, letter or a visit and sadly it does not hold us in a good light. One particular theme that is regularly discussed is when children have a falling out at school and parents transfer the situation to outside of the school. In most cases the problem is resolved and the children are friends again the next day, but due to parent phone calls, comments in the car park, outside the classroom or even at the shopping centre, the parents' relationship becomes fractured, hurt and sometimes irreparable.

If there is ever an issue at school, let the school deal with it together the children and their parents. It does not need to become a community discussion on Facebook, Cockburn Chat, carpark or in aisle 3 at the local IGA.

I always say to new parents and also new staff, it is not the message that is hurtful, but the manner in which it is delivered. My mother would always remind me to speak well of others and if I can't then don't speak at all. A Principal I worked with always made sure that when he had to speak with people and deliver a difficult message, he kept his dignity and respected the dignity of the other person. We are all good people at heart who want the best for our children, each other and ourselves. In wanting the best we need to also make sure that Jesus is in on our conversation with others. In this way we keep our dignity intact and are respectful of the dignity of the other person.

Illnesses at school



Over the last three/four weeks we have had a large number of children come through sick bay who have needed to go home due to being unwell. It is important that parents keep children who are unwell at home until they fully recovered. A large number of staff have also been unwell. I know that it is hard if parents are working full-time, but it is imperative in the stopping of other children and staff becoming unwell, that sick children remain at home. In fact, I was even sent home by the Office yesterday due to illness.

The only drive through and drop of area in our school is in Drive-Through and not the front of the school between Pre-Primary and the Office. Please comply with the correct procedures for the wellbeing of all. Thank you.

Aim: To provide strategies for families to teach their children how to <u>respond</u> if they are being bullied at school

Talking with your children about being bullied

Many children who are bullied do not tell a trusted adult as they think they are dobbing.

'Dobbing' is when a person deliberately tries to get attention or to get someone else into trouble.

'Asking for help' is when someone feels the situation is out of his/her control and he/she is unable to deal with it alone. If anyone sees someone else in this situation they should also ask for help.

What are students being taught at school to help them deal with bullying situations?

All students at our school are being taught that:

When I have a problem I can:

- Try to stand up for myself in a positive way
- Try to talk with the person I am having a problem with
- Walk away and ignore the person completely
- Get help from a teacher or another person I trust
- Ignore the situation and keep playing or working
- Talk to a friend to get some ideas to help me make a decision or
- Try coming to an agreement with the other person

You can reinforce these messages by discussing them with your children at home.

Consider trying some of these ideas to improve the way you talk with your children about tricky issues.

Sit shoulder to shoulder or walk with your child as you talk

• Talking face to face can be quite confrontational, particularly for boys. Sitting or walking side by side will encourage both you and your child to talk freely.

Use open-ended questions

• It is easy to ask your child if they had a good day or if they would like toast for breakfast; however these questions only require a yes or no answer.

• Try asking questions such as "What did you do today?" or "What would you like for breakfast?" These types of questions encourage discussion between you and your child.

Talk with your children about what to do rather than what not to do

• It is common for us to focus on negative behaviour, such as "don't step in that puddle" or "stop swinging on your chair".

• Try telling your children what you would like them to do rather than what you don't want them to do.

• You can do this by using positive statements such as "please step over the puddle" or "please put the chair legs on the floor".

Child Protection Week Safeguarding Protective Behaviours Parent Workshops

The Perth Catholic Archdiocese Safeguarding Program is child focused and informed by a fundamental belief that children have the right to physical and psychological safety at all times.

Whilst the Safeguarding Program is working hard throughout the Perth Catholic Archdiocese, we all must play our part to protect children and keep them safe. During Child Protection Week, the Safeguarding Office in partnership with WA Child Safety Services will be hosting a series of Protective Behaviours Workshops. One way in which parents can assist in increasing their child's safety is by teaching them the *Protective Behaviours Program* and as such we strongly recommend all parents attend a workshop. These workshops have been designed to teach parents and carers how to increase the personal safety of their children. Whilst there are many ways of talking to children about their personal safety, it is important that we do not scare them or leave them feeling unsafe, afraid or disempowered. Our new resource *Protecting God's Children* provides parents with strategies to increase their children's safety and cope with situations that threaten their wellbeing and personal safety. The program empowers the individual with the right to feel safe and sets out ways in which they can gain the appropriate help.


