## **First Sunday of Advent**

Advent is the time we prepare for the coming of Christ into our world. He is here already, of course, but he wants to come closer. Let each of us be one of his entry points by keeping awake to open the door when he knocks.

## **Gospel Reading:**

Mark 13: 33-37

In Mark's Gospel this week, Jesus is like a householder who has gone on holiday. He has left his servants – that is, you and me – in charge of his affairs, each with their task. What is my task, my role in this world? "Stay awake because you do not know when the master will come back" – "stay awake." How do we do that? Very simply. We keep in touch with those around us by each day, doing our best to live lives of love, compassion, forgiveness, honesty, and integrity. We keep in touch with our God through lives of prayer. And the simplest and deepest prayer is to be aware of the active presence of God permeating every single moment of every single day.

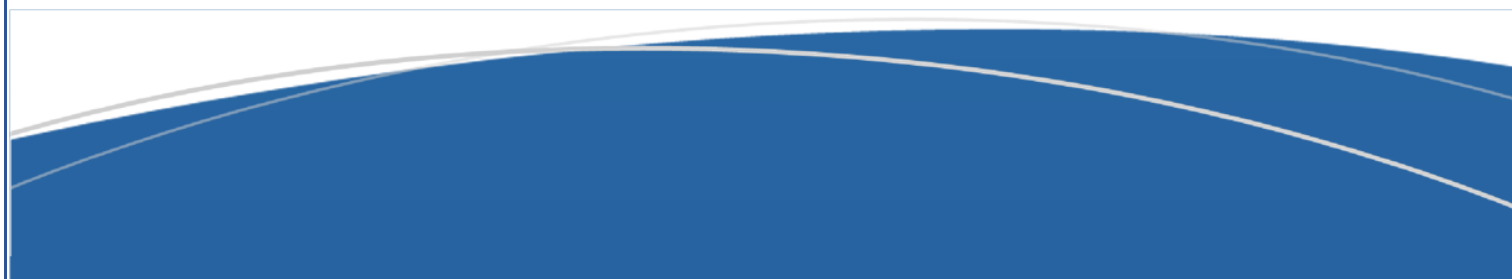

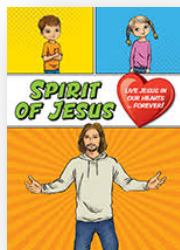

# Christmas Family Prayer

The reading we share today is from the Gospel of Luke (2:8-20)

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified.

But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger."

And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favours!"

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them.

But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

## Reflection

For each member in our family, our birth story is very special and there are moments of joy in the celebration but to be announced by an angel, as this Gospel writer tells us is what happens for Jesus, is really amazing!

The announcement is made to shepherds. Shepherds were what we would today call poor and disadvantaged. Yet the announcement of Jesus' birth is made to them which tells us right from the very start of Jesus' life, that he came for all people, especially those who were having a hard time.

2020 has been a challenging year for each of us. We have not been able to go to school sometimes, to pray together, to play sport together and visit our friends and families, some for long periods of time. What this story reminds us this Christmas is that there is great joy in the birth of Jesus, and it brings us hope.

Each of you might like to share together a joy from this year and hope that the birth of Jesus brings you for 2021.

For those who are at work this Christmas, particularly those who have worked so hard in healthcare during this year, we pray to the Lord.

For all those who in have been sick during 2020 and for those who have died, particularly those who have been affected by Covid, we pray to the Lord.

For our own needs, we invite each person to offer their own prayer [at this time each person may like to share something they would like to pray for], we pray to the Lord.



We are now taking enrolments for the Instrumental Program for 2021 and registration forms must be **completed by Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> December** to ensure a place.

The Mater Christi Instrumental Program is offered to students in Pre-Primary to Year 6 who are interested in learning an instrument.

Learning an instrument is both a challenging and rewarding experience. We currently have approximately 100 students enrolled in the program.

Mater Christi is currently offering the choice of the following instruments:

- Piano
- Guitar
- Drums
- Voice

If you would like your child to participate in the Mater Christi Instrumental Program for 2021, please complete the **Instrumental Program Tuition Agreement** and return it to school.

**If your child is currently enrolled and intends to continue next year, a new Instrumental Program Tuition Agreement is required to confirm re-enrolment in 2021.**

Lessons will begin in Week 2/3, Term 1 2021. Tutors will notify you of lesson days prior to the commencement of lessons.

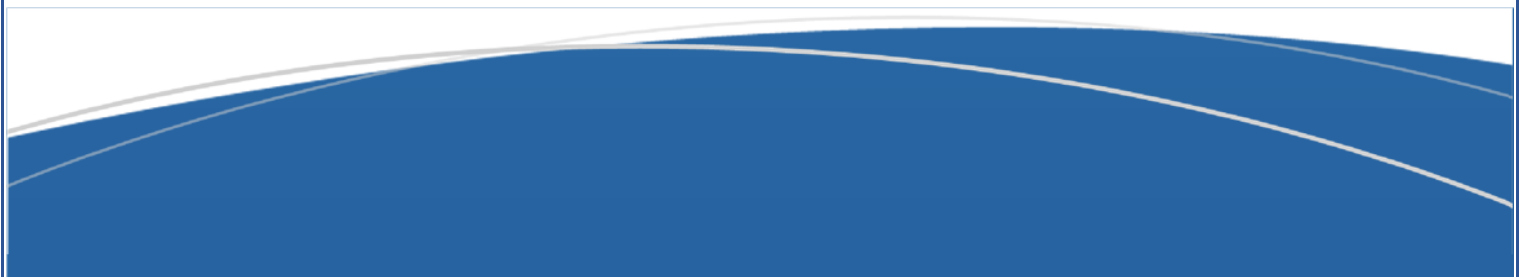

### **Instrumental Program 2021 Information**

#### **LESSONS**

Students will receive weekly lessons which can be taken individually or through shared lessons of 2-3 students. Lessons are held during school hours and are scheduled on a rotating timetable. Please note that group lessons are not available for **Voice**.

Individual Lessons	30 mins	8 lessons per term	\$250
Group Lessons	30 mins	8 lessons per term	\$180

#### **PAYMENT OF TUITION**

Fees for lessons are to be paid at the start of each term. Tutors will invoice and advise when the payment is due. Payments are to be paid directly to the tutor. There are 8 lessons per term, due to the school's scheduled events and tutor availability.

#### **PRACTICE AND COMMUNICATION BOOK**

Each student will be provided with a practice and communication book. Tutors will use this book to communicate with parents regarding homework or any other important information.

#### **PURCHASING OF MATERIALS/TEXT**

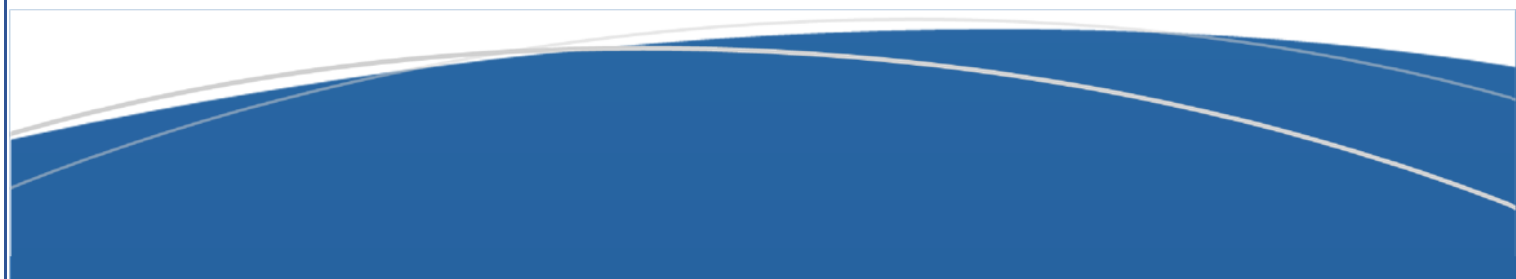
Tutors will specify books that are used for students to learn and practise from. It is the responsibility of the Parent/Guardian to purchase these books as soon as possible. Tutors are aware of costs and try to keep requests at a minimum.

#### **WITHDRAWAL OF LESSONS**

If your child wishes to withdraw from the Instrumental Program, it is required that both the Instrumental Tutor and the Instrumental Coordinator are informed of this by Week 5 of that term.

#### **INSTRUMENT HIRE**

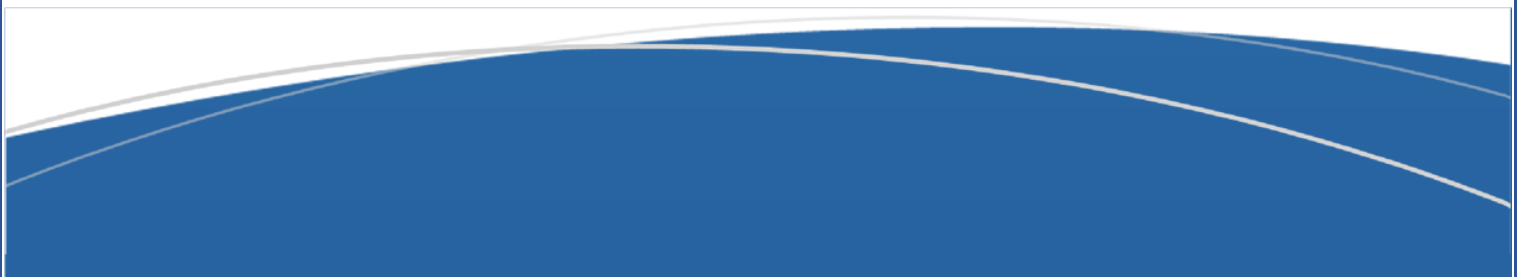
If instrument hire is required, this is to be arranged directly with a hire company. The school does not hire instruments.



## **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

- **A minimum of five weeks written notice (this does not include holiday periods) is required from parents if you wish to withdraw your child from the Instrumental Program.** Lessons will not be cancelled until written confirmation is received from parents. Please send an email to [jane.king@cewa.edu.au](mailto:jane.king@cewa.edu.au) and inform the Music Tutor.
- **You may be charged for missed lessons due to student illness.** As a matter of courtesy, please call or send a message to your child's Music Tutor so that they are aware of your child's absence. Whenever possible, tutors will try to reschedule the lesson, although this cannot be guaranteed.
- Music Tutors must be notified **1 week in advance** if a student cannot attend a lesson for reasons such as school camp, excursion or school related event.
- Parents must give a **minimum of 3 weeks' notice to Music Tutors if they intend on taking holidays** during this time. If sufficient notice is NOT received the students will be charged for lessons.
- Fees are on a per term basis. **All scheduled lessons must be paid for.** Missed lessons will not be re-scheduled unless at the fault of the tutor. **Students will receive 1 lesson per week, or 8 lessons per term.**
- **Fees are to be paid directly to the Music Tutors upon receipt of the invoice.**
- Students will be given a **communication diary** at the commencement of the year which is to be brought to all lessons. This is the communication between parents and the Music Tutors regarding your child's schedule lessons, homework and issues requiring attention.
- Parents are expected to encourage regular home practice, check and sign the communication book on a weekly basis.
- Where rental of an instrument is necessary the cost is to be paid by the parent/guardian directly to the hire company.

***\*Please note that commencement of tuition implies agreement with all conditions stated.***

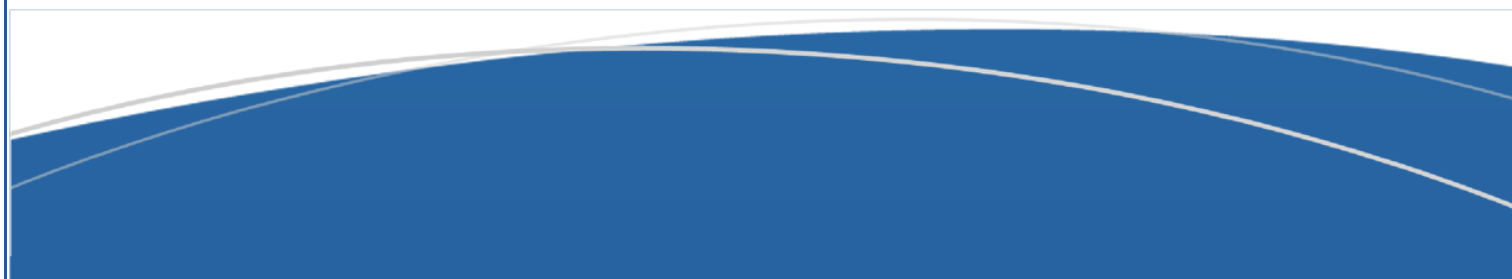
