#### **Religious Education News**

CHANGES REGARDING MASS ATTENDANCE AND COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS As of Saturday 5th December, all people attending the church AT ANY TIME including Mass celebrations, will be required to have their presence recorded. We will have a QR Code specific to our church which you are required to scan if you have a smartphone.

You are required to download the SafeWA app onto your phone from either the App Store or GooglePlay Store and load your personal data. When you arrive at the church you will then just need to scan the QR code and complete the very brief question section. If you do not have a smartphone, you will have the opportunity to have your name and details recorded on a paper register that will be stored securely in the parish and kept for the mandatory 28 day period (or longer should the need arise). The register will destroyed as per the government directives.

#### **School News**

We are excited to reveal that in 2021 Mater Christi will be transitioning to a fresh new look e-Newsletter! To communicate school news to our parents in a mobile device friendly format, we will be using the Schoolzine app (SZapp). The Schoolzine app will replace the current Skoolbag app that parents use to notify us of student absence and receive important real time notifications about school events. This app will be used for notifying the school of a student's absence using the absentee form and will contains other important links to school information such as the Term Calendar, Online Canteen ordering and School Uniform ordering. We strongly encourage parents download the SZapp (instructions provided below) in readiness for 2021 to ensure that you have up-to-date school information, and you can view the new e-Newsletter format easily. By subscribing to the SZapp, you will have the option to subscribe to one or more groups (ie Yr One, Yr Six) that pertain to your child/s year. The information within the app is secured by a four-digit passcode which you will receive at the beginning of each year via an email. Please take the time to uninstall the Skoolbag app and read the installation instructions below for the SZapp so that you are prepared for our first e-Newsletter in 2021.

Upon installation of the update, you will be asked to allow access to storage on your asked to allow access to storage on your device. This is required to ensure that SZapp can access the necessary files to store crucia data on your device.

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6. MANAGING NOTIFICATIONS

Choose which group/s you would like to receive notifications from. Groups with arrows indicate that there are sub-groups which you can join.

#### **Interschool Basketball**
