

Mini-Marathon


This Friday we will be hosting our annual Mini-Marathon where the children will walk around all, or part of Lake Yangebup. Parents are warmly invited to join us and help with supervision on this walk. Please ensure students are wearing their sports uniform, have applied sunscreen prior to the walk, and are equipped with a full water bottle and hat.

The Mini-Marathon involves ALL children from K-6. Junior classes (PP/Yr 1) will do a return walk to and from the fence at the end of Cooper Road (15-20mins) and Year 2/3 will walk along the left side of the lake to where the path veers from the lakeside towards Osprey Drive (30mins). Senior classes will walk the track around the lake (50-60mins). Kindy children will do a walk around the school grounds during the week.

Road Safety around Schools



Children are vulnerable in traffic:

- They are not all road safety educated like adults.
- They are small, fragile and hard to see between cars.
- They have difficulty in judging speed and distance.
- Their peripheral vision is still developing.
- Their injuries tend to be more severe because of their small size.

• They are easily distracted and can move out into danger without warning.

We all have a duty of care.

Parents are the key training providers of road safety education for young children and are responsible for teaching them road safety skills and knowledge especially around schools.

How you behave in road safety is the way your child will learn. Please lead by example.

What can you do to keep your children safe?

- Allow yourself sufficient time to drop off / pick up your child. Avoid a last minute rush.
- Whenever possible, park a street or two away and walk your child to school.



• Start road safety awareness early – establish road safety practices and routines at a young age.

• Consider walking or cycling to and from school where possible. Walking to school has many benefits such as helping students to concentrate at school, lessens traffic congestion which means less noise and air pollution. By walking you are helping yourself and the broader environment.

• When out walking, practise the "Stop, Look, Listen and Think" rule every time you cross the road.

• Demonstrate and explain what your children need to look and listen for in traffic. Then have them demonstrate back to you.

• Children aged up to 10 years should always be supervised near traffic.

• If you must drive into the school zone, always drop off and pick up your children on the school side of the road making sure they use the footpath-side door.

All motorists and parents are reminded to slow down around schools and keep to the 40km/h speed limit when travelling through a school zone.

Why restrict parking around schools?

School zone parking restrictions are designed to help all road users maintain safe lines of vision in busy road environments.

The restrictions are **fair** because they allow a **turnover of vehicles** where parking space is limited.

Vehicles parked contrary to signs create a serious hazard for young children by reducing their view of approaching traffic.

Drivers should be familiar with the following street signs, commonly located around schools.



NO PARKING signs allow drivers to park for up to two minutes. The driver must stay within three metres of the parked vehicle.

The two minutes/three metres rule allows drivers to park briefly when dropping off or picking up older children. If you need to walk younger children into school, leaving your vehicle unattended, **you must park legally elsewhere.**



BUS ZONE OR BUS STOP zones must be kept clear at all indicated times. It is illegal to stop or park in or near a bus zone or bus stop unless you are driving a bus.

NO STOPPING zones must be kept clear at all indicated times. Signs are installed at locations such as intersections, pedestrian crossings and school zones to allow critical lines of vision for both pedestrians and drivers.



A no stopping sign or yellow line means absolutely no stopping.

Where you see a continuous yellow line or a no stopping sign you are not permitted to stop or park in these zones at any time. Even if you are only stopping to let someone out of the car, and regardless of whether you leave the engine running and stay in the car.

General Parking offences

Did you know you can be fined \$100 for any of the following offences:

- Stopping or parking on a footpath or verge
- · Stopping on or across a driveway or right of way
- Disobeying a no parking or no stopping sign
- Stopping at or near a bus zone or bus stop
- Double parking
- · Stopping or parking on or adjacent to a median strip
- Stopping or parking on part of a carriage way marked with a continuous yellow line
- Obstructing a carriageway
- · Parking against the flow of traffic

All Local Government Rangers are authorised to issue infringements. This can be done at the time of the offence occurring or soon after, with advice then being posted to the vehicle owner.
