Our strong tradition of teaching and learning continues this year with our hard working classroom teachers and assistants at school for many days in January ensuring they were well prepared to facilitate the children's learning during the term. This shows a great commitment and dedication on behalf of our staff – something you do not get at every school. I have really enjoyed visiting classrooms and seeing how well all the children and staff have settled in for the year ahead.

Parent Information Night: These sessions will be held on Tuesday 9 February for parents of children in Preprimary to Year 6 (**the first session at 6.00pm, which is repeated at 6.30pm, so if you have more than one child you can get to more than one presentation**). I urge you to be present at these meetings, to meet your child's classroom teacher and hear their expectations, routines, homework procedures, communication, reporting opportunities and curriculum for the year. Communication: As parents you are the main educators for your children and you work in partnership with the school. Communication between school and home maintains and builds this partnership. If you have a question or concern about your child's schooling, please contact your child's teacher as soon as possible rather than waiting. Often a problem is solved quickly this way. Research shows that if the children know that teachers and parents are working together for their betterment, the child will perform better at school.

School Upgrade: During the holidays our groundsman – Anthony, together with Ed and Luke have ensured that our school looks well maintained and a pleasing environment to work and play in. The Year Ones have had new furniture, wet area sink and cupboard as well as the inviting natural area outside 1A & B. They are already making great use of this outdoor area as an extension of their classrooms, new play area and a great meeting place for parents in the mornings and afternoons. Together with Divine Mercy the limestone and iron dividing fence has been erected and the showpiece of all the improvements is most definitely the undercover area. If you haven't seen it – maybe you will have an opportunity next week.

School newsletter: The school newsletter is published each Friday and the link to access the school website is emailed to each family. It is an important form of communication to parents and contains much information about life at school.

Collecting Students During School Hours

If you need to collect your child during school hours to attend an appointment, you need to go to the office first to sign out the child/ren. The Student Release Form then needs to be given to the class teacher before the child will be released. If you are arranging for someone other than a parent/authorised guardian to collect the student, this person needs to come into the school office with a signed note that states they are authorised to collect the student. If you know in advance that you will be collecting your child, please let the class teacher know in the morning.

Punctuality

School lobbies open at 8.30am. Please make every effort to have children in class on time ready to start the day by 8.45am. Being settled can and does make a significant difference to what your child gets out of their day. It is also important in order that the teaching and learning programme for the children already there is not disrupted.

School Attendance - Absentees

If your child will be absent or late to school, it is important to ring the school office on 9417 5756 or email us absentee@mcps.wa.edu.au before 9am. All messages or emails should include the child's full name, class and reason for absence. Any student arriving after 8.45 must come to the office to sign in before going to class. If the school has not been contacted by 9.30am an SMS will be sent to your mobile number requesting you to contact the school to explain the absence. It is a legal requirement that the school receives a signed note for all student absences, therefore if an email has not been sent we will require a note upon your child's return school. For extended absences such as holidays, please visit the office to complete a pink Leave of Absence Form.

Parish News

Sacramental Program 2016

In keeping with the Archdiocesan Policy for the proper preparation of children for the Sacraments of Initiation, our parish implements the policy for the Sacraments of Initiation being **Family Focussed, Parish Based and School Supported**. The need for these experiences is important for catechesis.

Family Focussed: The responsibility for this preparation belongs firstly with parents. This reflects the teaching of the church, which is, that children being initiated into the Church should be able primarily, to look to their parents and family for the necessary nurturing of their faith.

Parish Based: It should be noted "the pre-eminent place for catechesis" is the parish (Catechesi Tradendae 67). The parish is the place where people learn to live as a faith community.

School Supported: The role of the Catholic schools in supporting Sacramental programmes for young people is to nurture strong partnerships between family and parishes (Catholic School Mandate para 80). In the same way the Parish Religious Education Programme (PREP) is designed to support children who attend non-Catholic schools with their preparation.

Generally children in Year Three make their **First Reconciliation**, children in Year Four receive their **First Holy Communion**, and children in their final year of primary school, receive the Sacrament of **Confirmation**.

Therefore, **all children wishing to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation, in our parish will register with the Parish at the start of the school year**. It is imperative that the children are enrolled at the commencement of the year so their Sacramental preparation can be full and complete. Sacramental dates for 2015 are as follows:

*You and your child's presence at these Masses and Parent/Child Workshops form an **important part of your commitment to Sacramental preparation** and as such are **NOT OPTIONAL**. There will be **NO LATECOMERS MASS** opportunities for people not present at their allocated Masses and the workshops will only be conducted on the given date.*

** These dates are published in good faith, however, due to unforeseen circumstances, may change. In this event, as much notice as possible will be given. **

After School Pick Up

All children who are not walking, cycling or being picked up at the classroom at 3.05pm will need to go to the undercover area where they will be supervised by the teachers on duty. Other arrangements with after school care providers are fine. Please do not ask your children to wait for you in a different location.

If you do not wish to use the drive through area, please park your vehicle and collect your children from the undercover area.

All children must be collected from the school grounds by 3.30pm.

If you are running late, please make alternative arrangements to have your child collected.

Allergy Aware

In 2016 we have students in our school with severe allergies. Touching these items, as well as ingestion, may provoke a reaction. Due to the seriousness of this allergy, we are asking you to refrain from sending nut based products to school for recess, lunch and birthday treats.

Appropriate steps have been put in place to ensure Mater Christi is a safe place for all our students. We ask that you also take the time to talk to your child about the following tips to help decrease the risk of any student having an allergic reaction.

These include:

- Not sharing food
- Washing their hands before and after eating since some students can have reactions on contact (such as a doorknob, playground equipment, computer etc).
- Avoid bringing foods to school that most often cause an allergic reaction eg nuts and nut based products.

We thank you in advance and we appreciate your cooperation in making our school a happy and safe environment for everyone.

Dear Friends and Colleagues,

As I did last year I want to take this opportunity to wish you all a very happy and fulfilling 2016 as the new school year gets underway. In a special way I want to acknowledge all those who are joining our Catholic system for the first time. I hope you find your time with us to be richly rewarding.

In our Catholic world this year we are living a jubilee Year of Mercy, called for by Pope Francis. For that reason I want to invite all of you to put at the heart of your efforts this year this quality of mercy. No doubt "mercy" means different things to different people. In my own reflections I have come to think of it as being all about "large-heartedness". Mercy calls us to go beyond the letter of the law, or the strict limits of our contracts, or overly-careful calculations about what we or others deserve. "Large-heartedness" calls us to look at life through a different lens, with different eyes. We don't look so much at what we, or others, deserve or have earned or have a right to. We look at what will be most enriching, life-affirming and uplifting. We try to look at a person's deepest needs and hopes, rather than at their "just deserts".

In our schools this will obviously play out in our relationships with the young people we serve who are, of course, our central concern. But it will also play out, very importantly, in our relationships with each other, and with the parents of our young people, even those who can at times be very demanding or even, in our view, unreasonable.

Pope Francis has reminded us that Jesus himself is "*the face of the Father's mercy*". A Catholic school community, grounded as it must be on the person and teachings of Jesus, has as a primary responsibility the task of reflecting this face of Jesus, this face of mercy, to all those who come in contact with the school. But as well as being a serious obligation for all of us who are part of a school community, this is also a recipe for a truly harmonious, happy and life-filled school.

May your school be a reflection of the face of divine mercy in 2016.

The Emmanuel Litter Task Force would like to invite students from Mater Christi Catholic Primary School to join the Enviro Club for 2016.

History

In 2011 Emmanuel started a committee to deal with litter and waste in the College. Since then, students have been involved in leadership opportunities, workshops, creating and maintaining the College garden, worm farms and recycling programs covering paper, cans and mobile phones.

The Litter Task Force has won a number of awards and has worked to gain and maintain accreditation as a Waste Wise and Keep Australia Beautiful Clean school. In 2014, the Litter Task Force won the Keep Australia Beautiful STAR Youth Achievement Award as well as the overall Chairman's Award for Excellence. In 2015 the College won a Highly Commended Award at the Waste Authority's Infinity Awards in both the categories of Waste Wise Schools and Waste Champion (Lee Durrant 2014 Environmental Captain).

Enviro Club

Created in 2013, the Enviro Club is aimed at year Seven-Nine students and looks at the practical side of the environmental programs at the College. The Enviro Club maintains the worm farms, organises the can recycling and looks after the College veggie garden. Students bond over afternoon tea before heading off to complete a number of environmentally friendly tasks to help close the waste cycle. Students get to take home the produce they have helped grow. Last year we had a bumper harvest of celery, chives and parsley to name a few. Students also got to take home tomato plants, cuttings from various plants and their own little worm farm.



was demonstrated last year with a number of students from Hammond Park Catholic Primary working in a pilot program in 2015.

We would like to offer the high school students a chance to develop their environmental leadership whilst teaching Mater Christi students the importance of recycling, worm farming and how to reduce the amount of waste produced. This is based on an environmental education model called 'Kids Teaching Kids'. The older students will be involved in planning the activities and teaching the younger students how to complete the tasks. This

Sessions run fortnightly on Monday afternoons. Afternoon tea starts at 3:30pm with Enviro Club activities usually starting around 3:40pm. Sessions finish at 4:45pm unless started otherwise. Once your child has signed up a program of dates will be sent to you with fortnightly email reminders. Due to the nature of the work we will be completing we are inviting students from year two to year six only.



Parking and Traffic Flow around the School

Below is a reminder about our Parking and Traffic rules to ensure the safety of our children at all times. We ask for you to exercise patience and caution.

- The first driveway with green arrows is 'drive-through' and is for pick-up and drop-off only. Overtaking in the 'drive-through' to get to the back of the school is potentially dangerous. If there is a need to gain access to that area, drivers must wait in the queue.
- The second driveway with blue arrows is for parking, and getting out of the car to walk in to the school to collect children. This area has an 8km speed limit.
- Please be courteous to others and allow them the time to 'Reverse park'.
- Stopping or double parking is not permitted. Please only park your vehicle in a designated parking bay.
- Please do not ask children to wait for you at the front of the school or on the oval. They are to wait in the undercover area where they are supervised.
- The 'Baby Bays' are for the use by parents/guardians with prams.

Thank you for remembering to reverse park! It is the safest option. Parking information is on the school website. If you have a towbar, please try to reverse park short of the brick paving on the oval side, so that walkers can get safely past your vehicle. The oval will be open next week as well, until more people start using the drive through. Please do **not** park on the grass or paving around the school.


