From the Executive Director: It is with great sadness that I write to inform you of the passing of Monsignor James Nestor.

Monsignor James Nestor became Director of the Catholic Education Office in 1968, amidst grave uncertainty about funding and the future of Catholic schools. Recognising the need to continue to develop Catholic education, particularly overall governance, he formed the Catholic Education Commission of Western Australia (CECWA) in 1971 and was appointed Chairperson. Archbishop Goody placed great faith in Monsignor Nestor and CECWA in its work to draw together the system, as we know it. Bishop Quinn acknowledged him when he said "he was by nature a person who could dialogue and who wouldn't be running a campaign to win an argument .... a person who would be seeking the truth, a great listener...able to explain clearly and thoroughly decisions that might not immediately be acceptable to a person". He was a man of intellect, integrity, wisdom, vision and a tireless worker for Catholic education and his God. The families and children of Loreto Nedlands would recall with fondness his work as Parish Priest.

He was also awarded the papal medal Pro Ecclesia et Pontifice (for Church and Pope) by Pope Benedict XVI for his work in creating a state wide system of Catholic schools in all four dioceses. Catholic Education Western Australia owes an immense debt to Monsignor James Nestor for leading the development of the unique system of 163 schools across the state. This is commonly cited as a reason for Catholic Education Western Australia being considered the jewel in the crown nationally.

We should give thanks to the visionary work he undertook and the legacy he has left our 163 schools and almost 80,000 students. Rest in Peace Monsignor Nestor.

#### <u>3rd Week of Lent – Project Compassion – brings you Dominic's story</u>

Dominic lives with his wife and four children in the Jiwaka Province of Papua New Guinea (PNG), where generational poverty has led to many challenges, including inequality, alcohol abuse and violence.

Dominic admits that he too faced some of these challenges. But when Caritas Australia and local partner, the Sisters of Notre Dame, established the Community Conversations program, he saw an opportunity to create change.

"I was inspired to hear of the different issues highlighted and processes used to come up with solutions," Dominic explains.

Through regular Community Conversations training sessions, Dominic learnt communication and problem-solving skills that helped him lead open, respectful community discussions in his village. By empowering everyone to voice concerns and play a role in community decisions, Dominic's village has achieved greater peace and increased respect, as well as reduced violence and alcohol abuse. Now, Dominic's community has a chance to thrive and create a better future for themselves.

"When we start to realise we have power to stand independently to change ourselves, help ourselves, we feel liberated," says Dominic. "I am most proud of the positive changes I am witnessing. I pass my big thanks and pray God will bless our supporters in Australia."



### **Crosswalk Etiquette**

Crosswalks are designed to keep pedestrians together where they can be seen by motorists, and where they can cross most safely across the flow of vehicular traffic.

When the children's crossing guard extends the flags, you must stop before the stop line if there is one and wait until the flags are removed before driving on.

You must not enter a children's crossing if the road beyond it is blocked by traffic.

You must give way to all pedestrians on a pedestrian crossing.

If we are all on the same page and using common sense then it goes a long way to keeping our students safe.

### Rainbow

When something significant happens in the family, the whole family is affected. Even though death and divorce appears to be a grown up problem, it does have a profound effect on the children it touches.

Rainbows is a program designed especially for children who are living in single parent families, or families going through significant transitions.

Rainbows fosters emotional healing among children grieving a loss from a life-altering crisis or other significant changes in their life. Rainbows provides a safe, confidential and caring environment for young people to sort through their pain and confusion, build self-esteem and learn coping tools to deal with their change, loss and grief.

The goal is to assist participants in expressing feelings, understand and talk about these feelings and to learn to let go of them and get on with living.

The facilitator assists the participants in expressing feelings.

The program consists of twelve weekly sessions conducted during school hours.

This year the staff member trained to facilitate the Rainbows Program is Michelle Romano.

# Step 4


The Skoolbag icon will then show on your home screen. This provides a shortcut to make it easy to view updates each day.
