HOLY WEEK DAYS

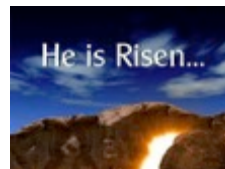
HOLY THURSDAY: Tonight is the night of the Last Supper. On the Thursday before Good Friday Jesus said, "a new commandment I give to you, that you love one another". Jesus showed His love for them by washing their feet. He wanted to show them that love knows no boundaries, has no hierarchy, and doesn't have the belief that I am more important than you. How am I challenged to love?



GOOD FRIDAY: This is the day on which Jesus was crucified. "Behold", sings the Church in venerating the cross on Good Friday, "by the wood of this tree, joy has come to the world".



HOLY SATURDAY is a time of preparation and of waiting, leading to the striking of the new fire, the light of the Risen Christ, dispelling the darkness of sin and bringing the light of salvation



to the world. The Easter candle is a symbol of the light of Christ.

Students Should Only Go To School Three Times A Week.

Reason One
