Kindy:

Welcome back to Kindy in Term Two. We hope you had a restful holiday and are ready to have even more fun. We are starting Parent Roster and are excited at the prospect of seeing many Mums and Dads joining in with our learning.

Our main curriculum focuses are:

- Developing vocabulary and speaking in short sentences
- Continuing name identification and name writing
- Improving our Peggy Lego Pre Writing Patterns
- Awareness of print concepts
- Learning about initial sounds
- Reinforcing one to one correspondence
- Introducing subitising skills
- Investigating size
- Making Jesus Real in our lives.

We will be exploring many enjoyable art and craft learning activities which you will see hanging around our bright and colourful classrooms or sent home to go inside your 'Making Memories' folder. We can't wait to share this experience with you all.

Pre Primary:

In Term Two the children will learn about different people and places within the community. We will be having many visitors who work in the community to come and speak to the children.

In addition to this the children will be creating and maintaining a vegetable garden. They will also identify good and bad bugs and learn some interesting facts about other mini-beasts.

As part of our Religious Education program we will be discussing the Church community and its importance in our lives.

Year One:

Welcome back to what will be another busy and challenging, but exciting second term. In Literacy we are exploring a range of different text types, working on our reading comprehension skills, continuing to practice sentence structure, and using punctuation effectively. The main focus in Numeracy will be enhancing our mental maths skills through a variety of activities. We will also be looking at time and money. In History and Religious Education we will be discovering the past and present and how things change over time to make the world as it is today. Thank you for your ongoing support.

Year Two:

This Term in Year Two we are learning about Fairytales.

In Literacy we will be developing our narrative and descriptive writing. We will also continue with reading & comprehension strategies.

During Maths lessons we will be learning about multiplication, division, shapes and measurement. We will continue to revise our Mental Maths Strategies.

'Beautiful World, Beautiful Me' and 'Gathered Together' are our Religion topics for this term.

In our inquiry program we will be taking a look into our communities and how our communities shape us. We are sure that this will be a great topic for discussion at home.

Don't forget to use our interactive Mathletics and Reading Eggs programs.

We are looking forward to an exciting and magical term.

Year Three:

Term Two is time for the Year Three students to become recycling marvels as they learn about sustainability in the environment.

At home they can cook up a storm as they discover how to write procedures and develop description in their writing.

They will continue to build their knowledge of reading comprehension skills, through guided reading activities.

Religious Education this term takes students on a discovery of what the true meaning of sin is and how we can show love to others, along with understanding why we receive Communion.

Protective Behaviours are a focus in Health as students learn how to be safe in all situations. We look forward to an exciting and busy Term!

Year Four:

In Year Four this term, students will be spending the first half of the term learning about Aboriginal History in Society and Environment. This topic is being integrated into Art and Procedure writing in Literacy. Students are also learning about Poetry, exploring the interesting and funny literary effects that can be added to their writing.

In the second half of the term, the students will be exploring the process of making laws in Australia. In Mathematics, we will be revising addition and subtraction whilst learning more about multiplication and division. We will also be exploring measurement and finishing off with an interesting statistics and probability investigation.

In Religious Education students will be exploring the topics of The Creator of Human Life and The Spirit Who Strengthens. In Health, students are focused on developing appropriate protective behaviour strategies that are useful in their everyday lives.

In order for the students to engage in the technological society that we live in today, they will be continuing to use MacBooks across all learning areas and all of us in Year Four are looking forward to yet another busy term!

Year Five:

This term we will be completing NAPLAN in week four and the children will be well prepared. In Number we are revising multiplication and division. In Measurement and Geometry we are learning about length, area, volume, capacity and mass.

We will be visiting the Perth Zoo, which will prepare the children for writing an information report on an imaginary junk yard animal.

The reading strategies, which we will be cover are: summarising, predicting, visualising and inferring.

The children will become experts on the Eureka Stockade and the Swan River Settlement as we study this in Society and Environment.

We will continue implementing the Making Jesus Real program support by the RE units of work 'We are Called' and "Relationships Restored."

Children will channel their inner marketing skills to create products to be sold to the school community as part of a fundraising event.

Although it is going to be a busy term we are looking forward to the excitement.

Year Six:

Welcome back to Term Two. It was wonderful to see students back at school full of enthusiasm and ready to learn.

Week 1 was spent exploring the history of our ANZACS. Students shared family stories and experiences and all showed respect and reverence at our ANZAC Assembly on Friday.

Term Two will be a big term for those students receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation at the end of Week 5. Students are busy preparing and learning about how they will fully receive the Holy Spirit at this very special time.

During our Numeracy Dedicated Time, Year Six is focusing on 3D shapes, area, volume and capacity along with some statistics and probability.

In Literacy Dedicated Time, students will be enhancing their reading comprehension skills while learning about Australian Federation and the birth of Australia as a Nation. Students will consolidate their knowledge of Australian History and Government with an excursion to Parliament House and the Constitutional Centre of WA in Week 11.

We look forward to sharing in a great term with you all!

Phys ED:

Term Two is going to be epic. It is a long term and as such we are going to try and fit in three awesome sports. We will start with Flagbelt rugby, which is a student favourite. After this we will move into some AFL football and soccer. It truly will be a football code extravaganza.

All students have the pleasure and challenge of practicing for the Cross Country Carnival that will be held at the end of term. Each student should be pushed to do their personal best and I am seeking to improve everyone's base fitness.

There are two Interschool Carnivals this term. First up is the Interschool Basketball Carnival followed by the Interschool Lightning Carnival for all Year Sixes and a couple of lucky Year Fives. We will also be holding League Tag Trials in preparation for the Interschool next term.

Drama:

The juniors will continue with the focus of "Creative Play and using our Imagination". The students enjoy and feel very comfortable in the world of make believe! The development of their confidence is certainly evident. Along with this there will be some classes that will have a focus on choral speaking in preparation for the Performing Arts Festival.

The senior focus is on "Readers Theatre", the emphasis is on reading aloud with expression. The group support in this situation is often enough to allow those who are weak readers to participate fully and develop their confidence! This can then lead onto staged performances with props and costumes within the classroom setting and even the stage! It is in this situation where we then develop the skills of performance.

RESILIENCY

- 1. **The Friendly Schools Plus** resource will continue to be a focus as we teach the students about being resilient and handling challenging situations they may find themselves in. A reminder our aim is to develop the student's social and emotional intelligence and this fosters the prevention of bullying behaviours.
- 2. **M.J.R.** (**Making Jesus Real**). This programme will also continue to be a focus throughout the school. MJR has a simple message – Jesus is part of our lives and can change the way we live, we can make Jesus real through our daily actions and words. Students learn about having a positive attitude and that their actions, attitudes and behaviours have an impact on their relationships. MJR provides students with a language that allows them to evaluate their thoughts and behaviours and provides strategies for alternative actions. It teaches them about being a welcoming person who encourages others, a person who can say sorry and thank Students learn about including people, making eye contact and the importance of forgiveness and gratitude. An important aspect of MJR is learning how to recognize God Moments in our daily life!
