Uniform Policy

We have recently updated our uniform policy. You can access the full policy on our website or via the Skoolbag Smartphone App. Below is some excerpts from the policy that have been changed.

<u>Hair</u> must be neat and styled in a manner in keeping with primary school standards. Hair ties and clips are to be plain and in school colours only (no logos or licensed merchandise). Students with hair longer than collar length are to wear their hair tied back. All hair must be clean with fringes above the eyebrows and no visible hair products are to be used.

Only **School Socks** purchased at the Uniform Shop are permitted.

For clarification:

- 1. School shoes heel is to be no more than 3cm in height.
- 2. Black "School Shoes" suggest the type of shoe is similar to the type manufactured by Clarkes, Bata Scouts or Rivers. Suede or canvas type shoes are not classified as "school shoes" and are not suitable.
- 3. Hairstyles "in keeping with primary school standards" means that, for example, hair product and 'rats tails' or 'patters' shaved in the side of hair are not to be worn. Hair ties and clips are to be plain and in school colours only (no logos or licensed merchandise).
- 4. All items must be clearly labeled with the child's name including surname. Names can fade with washing so please reapply when required.
- 5. Pre-owned items need to have the previous owner's name removed before being renamed
- 6. Children often accidentally pick up wrong items of clothing. Please check that what they are wearing actually belongs to them
- 7. Winter uniform is worn in Terms Two and Three. Summer uniform is worn in Terms One and Four. All children are expected to be in complete and correct school uniform from the beginning of each term.

NAPLAN Online Trial

You may have heard that NAPLAN online is being introduced from 2017, with an aim for all schools to be administering NAPLAN online by 2019.

NAPLAN online will provide better assessment, more precise results and faster turnaround of information. Your child's results will be returned to you faster, within a couple of weeks rather than a couple of months.

Our school has been selected to trial the new assessment platform (the computer system the test will be taken on). This trial shouldn't be seen as a 'test' of content, it is a chance for the new platform to be tested in a real-life classroom environment. This trial is called the Platform Trial and Readiness Test (PTRT).

During Weeks Five and Six of Term Three 2016, students in Years Three and Five will participate in a trial of the assessment platform, by undertaking two online readiness tests that include examples of the new NAPLAN online questions. Each test will take approximately 45 minutes to complete.

Participating in this trial is important as it will help us ensure we have adequate internet connectivity, and whether students have access to sufficient number of devices for NAPLAN testing. During the trial, schools will have the opportunity to practice managing the classroom logistics for an online assessment and the new test administration processes.

Feedback from schools participating in the trial will inform transition to the online assessment as well as provide valuable feedback to shape the final development of the NAPLAN online platform.

The readiness test has not been constructed to assess curriculum knowledge, but rather to provide students an opportunity to experience the *type*s of questions that will be included in the new online assessment.

Participation in this trial is a key step to ensuring a successful NAPLAN online experience and in gaining effective and timely use of student data.

Wow Term Three already! Welcome back to a fun and exciting ten weeks ahead. We will be encouraging the children to develop and explore their imaginations with our different themed home corners. We are continuing to focus on a story each week and will be making lots of wonderful creations in Kindy.

The main focuses are:

- Speaking in short sentences and narrative retell skills.
- Learning the sound of the letters S,A,T,P,I,N,M,R,C,H,E,D.
- Awareness of print concepts.
- Developing our news telling skills.
- Subitising with objects.
- Cardinality the last number represents the whole collection.
- Numeral recognition.
- Learning about our different emotions and feelings.
- Wondering about the water and rain cycle and how it relates to God.
- Developing our pencil grip, cutting and colouring-in skills.

News telling/ Sound Development

At the beginning of the week we ask that your child brings in one item (with their name marked on it) that begins with the letter/sound of the week. These items will be displayed on the sound table for the week for discussion about what items begin with this letter and sound. This item will also be used for their news telling. Items may include a photo, picture, drawing or an object.

The focus of your child's news telling is to describe the object. Children need to provide pieces of information about their object including its colour, shape, size and parts, along with the greeting and thank you. When practicing news encourage your child to use full sentences rather than just one word when providing information about the item.

It is required that each child brings in the following items: by week four:

- 1 medium sized sock for a sock puppet.
- 1 plain white men's t-shirt to make a gift for Father's Day.

Talking with your children about bystanders

Bullying involves more than the students who are bullied and those who bully others. Bullying often continues because people who are involved do not talk about it and seek help. This includes people who observe bullying – the bystanders. A bystander is someone who sees the bullying or knows that it is happening to someone else.

Bullying Situation Chart

- 1. Contributor
- 2. Witness
- 3. Supporter
- 4. Ringleader
- 5. Person Being Bullied

There may be bystanders who are afraid they may be bullied next and this may influence their decision about what they will do if they see bullying happening.

• There are different types of bystanders and in this model, they are described as:

Contributors – This group offer support to the person bullying, either by helping the person to bully the other person or by encouraging the person bullying. This group might gather to watch the incident (*sometimes from concern for the person being bullied, sometimes to see what will happen, and sometimes for enjoyment*).

<u>Supporters</u> – This group dislikes the bullying, is concerned for the person being bullied and actively tries to help the person being bullied.

What can bystanders do?

- If students see another student being bullied they should:
- Ask a teacher or support person for help
- Let the person doing the bullying know that what they are doing is bullying
- Refuse to join in with the bullying and walk away
- Support the student who is being bullied
- Support their friends and protect them from bullying (children who are alone are more likely to be the target of bullying, so encourage your children to be aware of children who are left out or on their own in the schoolyard).
