Dear Parents

This week the Leadership Team has been meeting with the teachers to discuss their planning and teaching for this term. As you can read throughout the Newsletter, our children are going to be active learners through a variety of engaging learning activities. I thank them for their commitment to their own learning, in challenging each other and in creating vibrant learning opportunities.

It is important to remember that learning is a process! We acknowledge that in life we don't always get it right the first time!!! When Albert Einstein was asked about his many failures he is said to have replied, "I have not failed. I've discovered ten thousand ways which do not work!" Our 'failures' can often be the forerunner to success; without errors being made much of our modern knowledge and way of living would not exist. We know that we are able to learn from our mistakes because 'a mistake' is an unintentional error. Mistakes can be painful when they occur but as time goes by they become known as experience and worthwhile, if we learn from them.

Mistakes by themselves are not bad, they are part of the way in which we learn, grow and mature. Mistakes should be regarded as experiences which give us information from which we can learn and make improved decisions – provided we don't take them too seriously. Likewise we can only learn from a mistake if we take ownership of it and admit that we made it. As soon as we start to blame other people for what occurred we begin to distance ourselves from any beneficial outcome. Accepting responsibility makes learning possible and though we can't change mistakes, we can if necessary, change how we respond to them.

Children make mistakes as they learn, grow and mature. Much can be gained if we discuss with them what went wrong and how, in the future, they might be able to avoid the same thing going wrong again. They need to be assured that mistakes can be fixed as a way of learning how to find better ways of being successful.

Just like adults, children need to take responsibility for their mistakes. We actually deprive them of this opportunity if we remove the burden of responsibility from them by accepting their responsibility as our own. Our children will not learn about consequences if there never are any. If we have a gentle guiding hand to offer our children to help fix their mistakes and solve their problems, we will give them skills that will make them happy and enable them to grow to be productive and responsible young people. Children learn by example, so, if we as parents can demonstrate the proper responses to mistakes, our children will be able to model their own behaviour and expectations, after our own.

Oral language skills will be further developed through our news program.


During Math lessons we will be learning about money, fractions and time.

Year Three:



Bonjour! Ciao! Guten Tag! G'Day! Dia Dhuit!

This term in Year Three we travel too and explore the different cultural celebrations around the world. This will culminate in each student writing an information report on a country of their choice throughout our Literacy program.

In Religious Education we cover the units 'Water of Life' (Baptism) and begin our preparations for the Sacrament of Reconciliation with the unit Christian Conscience (Penance).

In Numeracy the students will be 'spending up big' as they learn about Australian currency and currencies of the world.

Later in the term we will delve into the world of fractions and chance and data.

In Health we move our way through the body systems to find out how to maintain a healthy, balanced, lifestyle.

Integrated with our Literacy and SOSE program is Visual Art. Students will be provided with many opportunities to recreate traditional cultural artifacts.

Fasten your seatbelts, place your seats in the upright position and enjoy the journey!

Year Four:

The Year Fours have jumped out of the Term Three blocks with a bang! With a number of key focuses in each learning area this term promises to be a busy but exciting adventure for all involved.

The Term Three literacy writing focuses are information reports and descriptive texts. Students will have a number of opportunities to plan, create and write these two texts types using various ideas and topics. Students will continue using the Lexile reading system and participating in Dedicated Literacy Blocks every day with the 'Diana Rigg' program continuing to be a spelling focus across Year Four.

Numeracy Dedicated Time will see students undertaking skills practice, hands on activities and interactive tasks on mathematical concepts such as decimals, fractions, division, metal computation, problem solving, and money.

Term Three is a very special and significant time for all those in Year Four making their First Communion. Religious education will focus on the importance of this sacrament as well as two other units; 'Coming to Your Table' and 'God Knows Everything' to broaden the students' knowledge and understanding of these topics.

In SOSE this Term, the focus is Australian history, in particular, 'The First Fleet'. All Year Four classes will embark on an adventure through time to discover what it was like to be an explorer and a convict during the early settlement of Australia. In week eight the adventure will continue to the Fremantle Prison where the students will discover first hand the lifestyle of convicts and the punishments dealt out to them.

Term Three will be an exciting experience for all students, with preparation for the Senior Athletics Carnival. The Year Four team look forward to a fun filled learning experience. Don't forget to check out our blogs

Phys Ed

Term Three is all about Athletics. The whole school will be taken through its paces in a wide range of athletic endeavours. The students will be shown an elite style warm up and will then be immersed in the different facets of track and field.

The juniors will be focussing on the short sprints/relays and all of the team games that will make up our Athletics Carnival.

The seniors will move through events such as long jump, shot put, turbo jav and the different sprints as well as the twelve different team games they will participate in during the Carnival. Preparation is geared towards the Athletics Carnival at the end of the term (Check the calendar for dates).

At an Interschool level the school will be participating in a League Tag and Cross Country Carnival. Training has already commenced and the students are raring to go. Ryan Donnelly (HPE Specialist)

Year Five:

That's right, the Year Fives are heading on a journey around the world for SOSE this term and we will be learning about many different cultures.

In Literacy we will be getting our creative prose on and we will be looking at all different sorts of poetry and figurative aspects of language. We will also be looking into the world of conservation by delving deeper into some Australian texts in our Reading program.

Our Numeracy will be divided up into many different parts as we explore fractions, decimals and percentages. The chances of our success with this is highly probable as we explore statistics and probability later in the term.

In Health we will be learning about nutrition and communication and in Religion we will be feeding nutrition to the soul by covering the topics like 'Nourishing Our Goodness' and 'We are Called'.

With much more to do it's going to be a bumper term full of fun and learning. Let's take off and get on our way!

Year Six:

Welcome back to school for Term Three. I hope everyone is refreshed and ready for what promises to be a very busy term.

Firstly we welcome Miss McMahon who will be completing her final prac in 6C! We wish her all the best for this term and look forward to having her help and input in all our learning opportunities.

During Literacy Dedicated Time we will examine persuasive devices and strategies, which will then lead us into debating. This will culminate in a Debate Night to be held on Wednesday 16th September (Week Nine). We need as much support as possible to make it a great night so we would love to see you all there.

We will also have a look at advertising techniques and continue to focus on reading comprehension strategies during our Guided Reading Sessions.

Our Numeracy Dedicated Time will focus on fractions, decimals & percentages, data representation, calculating missing angles and problem solving.

During Religion we will explore how our bodies are used to express love for each other, Becoming a Man and a Woman' and a presentation from a special guest.

Finally, in Health we will learn about how our bodies work, with a focus on the respiratory system and heart health. We look forward to another busy, challenging and exciting third term in Year Six.

Welcome back to Science Term Three! – Hope you all enjoyed your holidays with your children.


They are super kids, I am so lucky to have such great kids to teach so thank you parents; you do an awesome job!

Drama:

For the first half of this term for many classes the focus is on rehearsals for the Performing Arts Festival as we are involved with Liturgical Drama, Choral Speech, Bible Reading and the Drama production "The Under Grounders".

- The junior students will continue to delve into the world of make believe but this term with a focus on puppetry as well as creative play. Through the use of puppets students can learn new ways to express themselves while learning new skills. This is another way of enhancing listening skills, developing risk-taking skills and providing students with opportunities to work cooperatively as a group and of course this all boosts self esteem.
- The senior focus is on developing the student's script writing ability. Brainstorming ideas, editing and processing their work, in order to perform as a group in front of their peers. Improvisation is also an area that will continue to be a focus. When students are given the opportunity for their imagination to run free, self-esteem and confidence flourish. They receive enormous positive stimulation discovering what they can do!
- In regards to Making Jesus Real, we will continue to deepen The Spirit of Jesus that is already in our school. The Friendly Schools Plus programme is an ongoing focus in all year levels, with the key area for this term being 'Relationship Skills.'

We are asking for you to encourage/assist your children to read and complete a reading log during the first half of Term Three.




