Dear Parents



In Sunday's gospel Jesus sits down and tries to get through to his disciples: "Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all." They had heard these opposites before--to save life/lose life, to be first - you have to be last, to be great - be a servant. But Jesus could see that they didn't get it. So he took a little child in his arms and put the child in the midst of them, "Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me, welcomes not me but the one who sent me."

Jesus wanted them to see the child. He wants us to see the child, too and welcome the child. Not because the child is innocent or perfect or pure or cute or curious or naturally religious. Jesus wanted them to welcome the child because the child was at the bottom of the social heap. In Mark's gospel children are often sick or disabled, they are not symbols of holiness or innocence, but more often they are the victims of poverty and disease. Jesus brings the child from the margins into the very centre. This child is not a symbol but a person, a little person easily overlooked, often unseen and unheard.

Was Jesus a hopeless romantic when he set a little child in the midst of the disciples that day? No, Jesus was not a hopeless romantic--he was a hopeful fanatic! Jesus was fanatic about seeing those nobody wanted to see; he was fanatic about extending hospitality to those considered no more than property. Jesus didn't follow the rubrics or the rules. He healed when he wasn't supposed to, touched people he shouldn't have touched and talked about suffering.

Let us pray. Holy and ever living God, you have named us as your beloved children. Move within our hearts so that we will bend down low enough to see the children in our midst and care for them as though they are part of our family. **Amen.**


Religious Education

MATER CHRISTI MINI-MARATHON 2015

Friday 23rd October

On Friday 23rd October we will be having a Mini-Marathon where the children will walk around all, or part of Lake Yangebup. Parents are warmly invited to join us and help with supervision on this walk.

The Mini-Marathon involves ALL children Kindy – Year Six. Junior classes (PP-Year One) will do a return walk to and from the fence at the end of Cooper Road (15-20 minutes) and Year Two – Three will walk along the left side of the lake to where the path veers from the lakeside towards Osprey Drive (30 mins). Senior classes will walk the track around the lake (50-60 minutes). Kindy children will do a walk around the school grounds.

Sponsorship forms are being sent home today. Your support in gaining donations/sponsorship from family and friends is encouraged. Please accompany your child on any visit to gain donations or sponsorship and feel free to take the form along to your workplace. The money raised will be used to subsidise the significant costs incurred by the graduating Year Six students next year. At some stage all children in the school will benefit from this fundraising.

A prize will be awarded to the highest fundraiser in the school and to four other lucky students who have raised money from sponsors. If your child did not receive a sponsorship form please ask at the school office immediately. We ask that all completed sponsorship forms are returned to school by Thursday 22nd October. The forms will be signed by class teachers and returned to the students after they have completed the Mini-marathon. Sponsorship forms and money should be returned to the office in a clearly labelled envelope as soon as possible after the 23rd October. The final date to have money back is Wednesday 4th November. Prize-winners will be announced via the newsletter on Friday 6th November.

We hope that as many parents as possible will join us on the day. All that is required of you is that you join a year group (as extra supervision). We would like three or four extra adults with each year level. Volunteers should be down at the oval by 8.50am on Friday 23rd October where you will join your chosen year group. Those walking with Pre-Primary or Kindy can join the classes in the classroom.

Please ensure your child has a water container and that asthmatic children have their up-to-date Ventolin inhalers with them.

Making Jesus Real



Making Jesus Real provides students throughout the school with a language that allows them to evaluate their thoughts and behaviours and provides strategies for alternative actions.

The students are encouraged to be welcoming and positive; they are able to willingly say sorry and thank you. The students are taught about the importance of including people, about body language, eye contact and the importance of forgiveness and gratitude. The importance of reflection is also encouraged, where they are called to ask the big question, WHERE WAS JESUS IN MY LIFE TODAY?



Our Focus - Social Decision Making

Developing social decision-making skills helps us to consider the consequences of our actions for ourselves and others and helps us to make thoughtful, effective decisions. This involves:

- Understanding how a social situation makes us feel
- Considering the different choices, along with the positive and negative consequences of these actions, when making a decision
- Making positive choices, while considering how these choices may affect ourselves and others

Through explicit teaching and role play the children will be learning how to respond safely as a bystander in a bullying situation.

The students are learning that to support someone when you see bullying happening has two benefits;

- 1. It helps the person being bullied
- 2. It sends a clear message to the person engaging in bullying behaviour that this behaviour is not tolerated in our school.
